LOS ANGELES, May 26 (AP)—After her death last August, Miss Wright testified, she and James took an apartment together—the apartment in which police arrested them several weeks ago.

An investigator for the district attorney read lengthy notes officials took on conversations they intercepted between James and his niece by means of a secreted listening device.

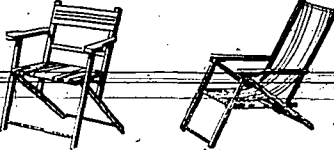

TRUCKS TAKE MEN TO FOREST FRONT

1300 South Idaho Recruits Leave for Northern Timber Lands

BORER, May 25 (AP) — Thirteen hundred WPA recruits moved out of Boise today in a 70-truck convoy enroute to the North Idaho white pine blister rust battlefront.

"Our biggest problem is to fill our quota of 8900 men," commented S. W. Wyckoff, of Spokane, director of the 23,000,000 project that will be carried on until October 1 in the great timbered domain of northern Idaho.

Wyckoff, a United States department of agriculture entomologist, came here to supervise the movement of the men who were assembled from all parts of south Idaho.

He also conferred with Dr. J. D. Dunbar, state medical officer, about sanitation problems.

Another convoy

"Another convoy will move out of south Idaho about June 6, he said, with additional recruits for the work which calls for removal of current bushes—agents which transmit the rust—from tree-to-tree—from the forests.

Of the 8900, 2000 will be furnished by the state of Washington, but not enough men can be obtained in Idaho to fill its quota of 3000—retailer and 2000 retail workers. The work of eliminating the forest parasite in Idaho timberland is only about half done, Wyckoff said.

He estimated that the infected area originally included 2,000,000 acres.

The campaign has been carried on for several years and about 2,100,000 acres remain, of which 400,000 is expected to be covered during the next three months.

HEARING PROMISED SUGAR TAX FOES

Opposition Appears to Proposed Revival of Processing Levy

WASHINGTON, May 26 (AP)—Senator King (D-Utah) said foes of reviving the sugar processing tax would be heard by a senate finance subcommittee before further consideration of adding the levy to the new revenue bill.

He said he understood "some Michigan people are objecting to it." The finance committee, King said, decided not to include the processing tax in a decade.

Consideration of the tax will be deferred to an amendment in the senate.

Representative Crawford (R-Mich.) said two farmer-directors of the Farmers and Manufacturers Beet Sugar association, J. B. Smith, of Alma, and Louis Burger, of Saginaw, Michigan, would appear.

Crawford said he would object to reviving the levy, if permitted to appear.

"Sugar is a poor man's food and the processing tax would be paid by the consumers," Crawford said.

Crawford said he doubted if legal means could be found, in view of the supreme court AAA decision of last January, to use revenue raised by a processing tax pay further benefits to producers, as suggested by members of the congressional sugar bloc.

Yearlings brought \$9.25 and ewes \$3.25 per 100 pounds. Shrink was 6.2 per cent. Shipping expense was 30 cents per 100 pounds of which 25 cents was local expense.

In sight of the association's next pool of lambs, estimated to be between 10 and 15 carloads of lambs, the association secretary said. Lambs will be loaded at all of the county's shipping points.

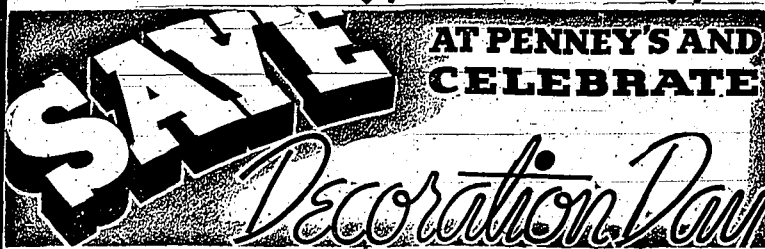

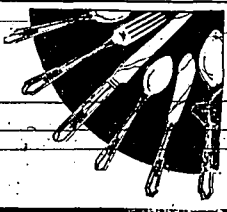
