Premier Strives To End France's Strikes

New Leader Takes Steps To Avert Complete Industrial Paralysis

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, June 4.—Socialist Leon Blum, immediately after taking over the guidance of troubled France, ordered two of his ministers tonight to act at once to avert a complete industrial paralysis of the nation.

Blum decided to appeal to the 500,000 strikers tomorrow in a radio address. These are the men who occupy factories, and the strikes were spreading as President Leblun officially handed over the government to the 35-year-old well-talented socialist.

Twenty of the new ministers whom Blum named are socialists who never before were in government, and the remainder are radical socialists. Three are women.

Meanwhile, Jean Chiappe, president of the municipal council, called a meeting of city officials to consider asking Paris police to see that the streets are kept clear of food, and to prevent any hindrance of public services.

WARRANTS CHANGE TERRORISTS WITH FLOGGING MEMBER

Witnesses Describe Murders, Whippings and Political Interference in Michigan Grand Jury Inquiries

(By The Associated Press) DETROIT, June 4.—The dread Black Legion was accused in another group of flogging warrants today as the grand jury of the hooded, night-riding terror band were being recounted in grand jury inquiries in three Michigan counties.

Witnesses described murders, whippings and alleged political interference, 15 more warrants were issued charging that Robert Penlan, a Black Legion member, was flogged by a large Black Legion gathering last October because he had not attended meetings of the group.

The new warrants disclosed when three of the 15 were taken into custody to join 17 others in the county jail awaiting completion of examination on abduction and murder charges for the "ritual" slaying of Charles A. Poole, young 26, by Prosecutor Duncan C. McCrea last 12 more will be arrested on John Doe warrants.

Death of Late Speaker Postpones Adjournment Of Congress Indefinitely

Senate Drops Debate; House In Brief Session Hears Eulogies And Names New Presiding Officer

WASHINGTON, June 4.—Ringed about by the great of the nation, the body of Joseph W. Byrnes, who died suddenly early today, will lie in state tomorrow in the house chamber over which he presided so long.

The greater grief-stricken who left the tobacco fields of his native state to scale the heights of public office, died of a cerebral hemorrhage at 12:15 a. m. Congressional leaders quickly suspended the week's adjournment and drove the house to adjourn at 12:15 a. m.

Just in front of the casket Mrs. Byrnes and members of the family will be seated, and behind them, places are reserved for the members of the cabinet, the senate and house and of the diplomatic corps.

Pratt, the speaker as "fearless, incorruptible, unselfish," President Roosevelt announced that for the first time in the history of the United States a special train to Nashville for interment services in the district where stands a symbol of democracy, the Hermitage, home of Andrew Jackson.

The house met only long enough to hear brief speeches of eulogy, adopt a resolution of sorrow and elect a successor to serve for the remainder of the session. Representative William D. Bankhead of Alabama, who had been majority leader.

The senate, engulfed in a bitter controversy over the new tax bill, met two hours earlier than usual to discuss its debate, but upon the announcement of the speaker's death it promptly recessed.

All hope of adjournment before the opening of the national convention next Tuesday was abandoned. The goal, said Majority Leader, Robert Taft, was to pass a tax bill to conference recess during the Republican meeting and adjourn June 15 or 16.

The adjournment drive, Byrnes had thought much of his energy. Friends said this was a completely unexpected heart attack which preceded the hemorrhage.

While Bankhead sat, listening at the leaders conference of the other present quickly decided the party's choice. It was to elevate their floor leader to the highest post, the house speaker.

The award is the highest honor that can come to any power and light company in the United States during any particular year and it is given to the company which during a year "has made the most distinguished contribution to the development of electric light and power for the convenience of the public and the benefit of the industry."

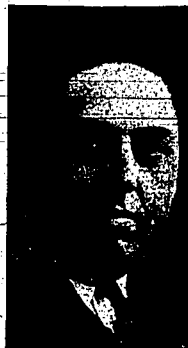
K. M. Robinson, president of the Idaho Power company, was in St. Louis yesterday for the national meeting of the Edison Electric Institute to receive the honor for his company.

The award comprises a gold medal to the company and \$1,000 for the employees' benefit fund and is made each year by the General Electric company under the sponsorship of the prize awards committee of the Edison Electric Institute.

Thomas M. McCarter, president of the Edison Electric Institute, lauded highly the Idaho Power company for its fine showing in Idaho.

"Naturally I am very pleased that our company and our state have been so highly honored by this national recognition," Mr. Robinson said today. "The credit for this recognition goes to the Idahoans who make up the fine family of our company. Regardless how much we thought we had accomplished the award certainly came to us as a very pleasant surprise. A meeting of representative employees of our company will be held soon to decide what the employees want to do with the \$1,000 and the gold medal will be put on display in the various divisions of the state which we serve. We are the outstanding accomplishment which the Idaho Power company had listed in the Coffin award presentation. The company serves a widely scattered territory, more than 400 miles in length, with 100 communities and a total population of 190,000."

# Three 'Favorite Sons' Bolster Crop Of G. O. P. Presidential Candidates

The candidates for the Republican presidential nomination from Ohio, North Carolina and Maryland are regarded as typical "favorite sons" by California and Maryland delegates to the Cleveland convention are expected to be backing candidates from their own states.

**BY ALEXANDER H. GEORGE**

WASHINGTON, June 4 (AP) - Eight men have joined the ranks of their own states for the Republican presidential nomination, but only three of them are regarded as typical "favorite son" candidates.

The other five are leading contenders for "dark horse" status in the race.

The strictly "favorite son" candidates are Robert A. Taft of Ohio, who has 47 of the 55 delegates from the Buckeye state; Governor Harry W. Nice of Maryland, who has 31 delegates; and Senator Charles McNary of North Carolina, who has 20 delegates.

The outright "dark horse" usually has scant prospect of winning the presidential nomination but his backers frequently put him up for that position in the hope that he may receive a "favorite son" designation or increased political prestige.

Unrestricted delegates from several states may cast honorary votes on the first or later ballots at Cleveland for "favorite sons" in the event, he may receive a complimentary vote as California's "favorite son" candidate.

The New York state delegation is also unrestricted, but Representatives James W. Wadsworth and Bertrand H. Snell, both of whom have been listed as potential presidential or vice presidential nominees, might receive "favorite son" votes.

Governor Landon, Senator Borah and Colonel Knox, who on the basis of pledged delegate support and showing in the presidential primaries are rated as leading contenders, are the "favorite sons" of their respective states.

Kansas' 18 delegates have been instructed to "put up" their eight delegates to the Cleveland convention for Borah. Official count of the primary vote showed that Colonel Knox had won a majority of the Illinois delegates. New Hampshire's backing of Knox also has been described as "favorite son" support.

Two of the most frequently mentioned "dark horse" candidates, Senator Vandenberg of Michigan and Senator Dickinson of Wisconsin, have been specifically instructed to vote for any candidate.

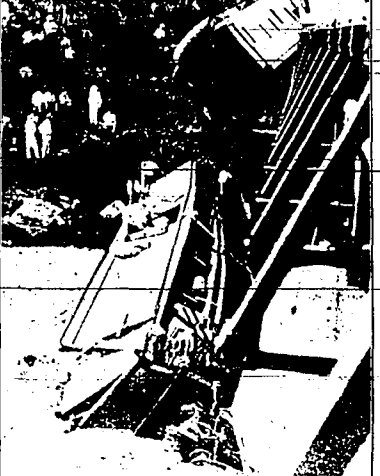
