New Method Of Broiling Steak Better Than Old

In one of his stories O'Henry, the famous writer, whimsically described the "proper" method for broiling a steak in this manner: "Simply place the steak in your pocket," said he, "and walk slowly through a hot-kitchen until you find the time you reach the other side, the steak will be done."

Temperature has always been an important factor in broiling steaks. Years ago, the accepted view seemed to be that a high temperature was necessary to broil a steak, but now this theory has been completely changed, and this change is thoroughly justified, for a lower temperature produces a more evenly done, juicy steak, without having the charred and sometimes burned exterior so often the result of a very high temperature.

Broiling Made Easy
Not only is a more satisfactory steak produced by low temperature broiling, but it is much easier, since only one turning is necessary. The steak is placed on a broiler from the flame or heating element that by the time it is nicely browned on top, it will be half done; then it is seared with salt and pepper, turned, and allowed to broil until done.

The temperature may be controlled in two ways, by placing the steak the proper distance from the heat, or by reducing the heat itself. If the oven regulator is turned to

"High," the steak should be placed so that the top of it is at least three inches from the flame or heating element. In case it is necessary to place the steak closer to the heat, then reduce the amount of heat in proportion.

Use Tender Steak
To make a satisfactory broiled steak, the steak, of course, should be a tender one in the beginning. Spread with your preferred mixture, place piece of cucumber on each and fill center with more of the mixture. Garnish as desired. Small tomatoes cut in halves, with seeds removed, may be substituted for cucumber slices. Open Cheese and Tomato Ginger Sandwiches

MACAROONS
2 egg whites
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup crumbled shredded wheat
1/2 cup walnuts, chopped coarsely

Beat the egg whites until stiff but not dry. Add the salt and then add the sugar slowly, beating vigorously all the while. Add the vanilla and fold in the crumbled cereal and nuts. Then drop the batter by teaspoonfuls on a greased baking-sheet an inch apart. For baking the oven must be preheated from 20 to 30 minutes or until the surface seems dry to the touch. Marked Political Shift Shown in New Digest Poll

Republican voters outnumber Democratic more than 3 to 2 in a new Literary Digest "pre-convention" poll of Birmingham, N. Y. The city's slight majority for Roosevelt over Hoover in 1928 was closely forecast by the magazine's 1932 presidential poll.

Secret ballots were mailed within the past two weeks. The Literary Digest states, to the entire 1936 registration list of 27,397 in Birmingham, 14,711, or 53.7 per cent, have been listed as Democrats in the current tabulation.

The ballots ask the voters to signify their choice of Democratic, Republican, Socialist, or "other party" choice and also to mark for whom they voted in the last presidential election. "Repeat in the margin of your party to another."

Landon receives 77.9 per cent of the 2,368 Republican ballots and Roosevelt is given all but 20 of 1,397 Democratic votes recorded.

Borch is second choice among Republicans, with 10.6 per cent of this party's vote and Hoover, third, with 5.9 per cent.

Of the 2,368 Republican ballots, 1 of the 57 votes cast for the Socialist party in the poll.

"The heart of every member of the house of representatives," said Bankhead, "is sorely torn and bruised this day, for here lies that great American who only the day before yesterday presided over the popular branch of our federal government."

Representative Snell, the Republican floor-leader, a personal friend, also spoke.

After the services, Mrs. Byrns clasped President Roosevelt's hand briefly and then, with her son, left the chamber.

BYRD GIVES PLEDGE TO CAUSE OF PEACE

Byrd conjured up in the thronged room of the white shirt and glittering formal gowns a picture like the one engraved on the medalion. It was of a gaunt, long-haired man skeletoned by fumes of a furnace, his face as pale as a hand-cranked radio that "all is well" to those no other lives would be risked to save his.

"I find that I must take charge of my mind or it will take charge of me," he had written. "The distance and detachment of this place seems to soften some human follies."

Folly of Follies
"But from here the great folly of all follies is the amazing attitude of civilized nations toward each other." Fear, antagonism and reprisals seem to be the rule among nations which, in their conduct toward each other, and I believe toward the rest of the world, are as much as the individual civilized citizens in his conduct toward his neighbor.

"I feel this so keenly that if I survive this ordeal I shall devote what I can to the cause of peace, trying to help further the friendship of my country with other nations of the world."

He said he was determined to "carry out the promise I made to myself during the long night."

Retired from the navy, and at 49 a world leader in polar exploration and aviation, Admiral Byrd had just completed a seven-month lecture tour during which he spoke to more than 600,000 persons in 136 cities.

He flew over the north pole in 1926, from New York to France in 1927, and over the south pole in 1929 in the first of two Antarctic expeditions. He returned in May, 1931, from his second southern venture.

TRACTOR OWNERS SUED FOR CONTRACT BREACH

Robinson Construction company started suit in the district court yesterday for \$200 damages from A. T. Tolson and Glenn W. Nielson on account of alleged breach of agreement under which Tolson and Nielson rented a caterpillar tractor and bulldozer equipment to the construction company for use in construction of the Washburn-Maryley highway in Lincoln county.

The complaint which was drafted by Walters, Parry and Thomas, Twin Falls attorneys, alleges the tractor and equipment were rented for removal of all of the borrow material in the construction of the estimated at 30,000 cubic yards, but that Tolson and Nielson refused to permit further use of their outfit which was contracted for three days this week in removal of 1500 cubic yards of borrow.

Under the alleged contract the construction company was to pay 8 cents for each cubic yard of borrow removed, minus operating expenses.

The construction company claims damages on account of the alleged fact that it built loading traps and arranged work pits and lay out for use of the rented equipment.
