Ross Representative Finds No Trouble On Idaho's Strike Front

Governor's Envoy Reports Situation In Clearwater County Will Be Ironed Out Without Violence

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, July 27.—Governor C. Ben Ross said tonight his military representative, Captain E. W. Abendroth, reported to him personally that he believed the Clearwater county lumbermen's strike "will be ironed out without violence on the part of participants."

Abendroth left after a few hours, returning to Orofino. He was assigned to Clearwater county a week ago to investigate conditions among the 2,500 strikers, who are demanding improved working conditions and changes in compensation.

Arrests in Kootenai BELLEVILLE, Idaho, July 27 (AP)—Where this area failed to make any progress in the north Idaho loggers' strike remained quiet, the sheriff arrested three men today on another front in the month-old dispute, first reported case of personal violence.

Predictions of strike leaders that an attempt would be made today to open Wehner construction camps in this area failed to materialize, and pickets spent the day idling in the shade while state patrolmen at Headquarters camp played checkers.

No attempt was made either to move 10 carloads of logs to the Wehner camp today. The logs have been loaded by small camp operators since the strike was called.

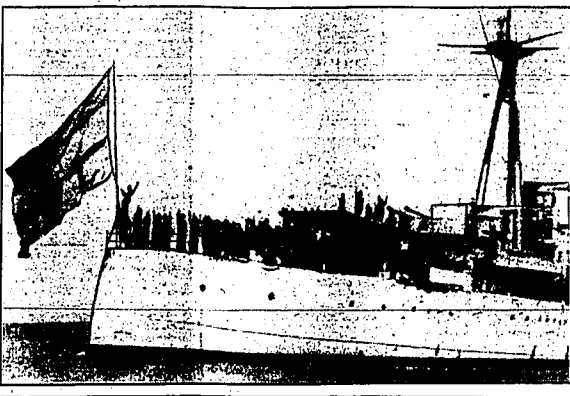

SEWER DISTRICT PLANS REVIVED

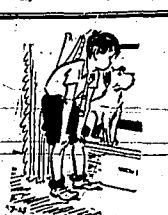
Property Owners Offer to Take Up Bonds in Blue Lakes Addition

Her withdrawal would leave the nomination open to Miss Bertha Noel who served in that office a number of years ago.

Gan L. Thompson of Buhl, a candidate both for the Democratic nomination for state senator and also for election as a precinct committeeman, told the county auditor he decided to withdraw as a candidate for committeeman.

Ballois will be available today for the primary election, the county auditor announced.

NEW RULING MODIFIES TAX FOR BEER SALES

Under the new regulations just released by the commissioner of internal revenue, organizations wishing to sell beer on some special occasion will be required to pay a federal tax of only \$2 for each calendar month in which sales are made.

Heretofore a special tax stamp as a retail dealer in malt liquor for the remainder of the fiscal year, was required of all persons or organizations selling beer, whether the sale was for a single day or for every day in the year. This special tax stamp cost \$20 for the full year.
