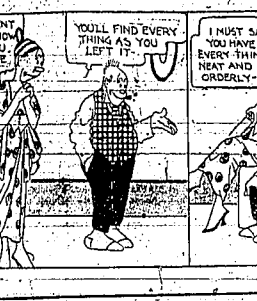

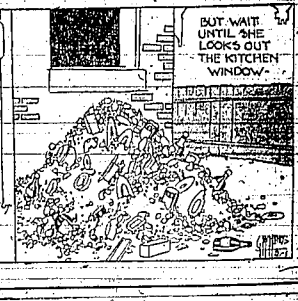

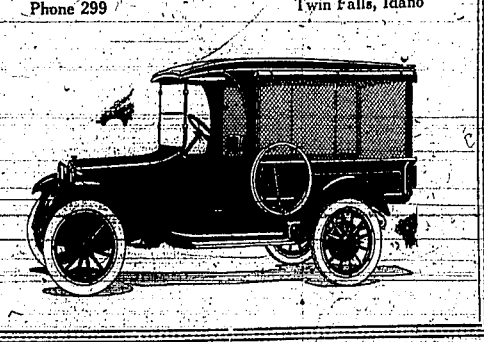

With But Little Thought and Care One Can Keep Shiny on Exterior of Car.

MUD ONE OF WORST ENEMIES

Great Care Necessary in Removing Dirt From Polished Varnish—Apply Wax Liberally, but Be Careful in Rubbing.

Second-hand car dealers know that they can take an old car and repaint it and restore considerably more for it than they could if the very best of its shabby appearance. They know that the average car buyer will first examine the appearance of the car, and then afterward try to find out if it is not because a higher value is placed upon exterior appearance than upon mechanical excellence. This is why the buyer the car will never be tested for its mechanical ability unless it first attracts the eye.

Pride in Appearance

A car owner is not a genuine, idealist unless he takes the time to keep the finish as long as possible and how to restore it when it grows thin through wear and two or three points in his mind. The city man who keeps his car in a garage generally has to do the work for him, and it must be said that very often they are unskilled and the result is that a new car will soon look like an old one.

Another great burner of car finishes is the hot body polish. Very often this will take a car's body completely and then the surface becomes dull and it is difficult to restore it. In the other hand, there are many very good polishes on the market which do the work well. Some of these place a coat of veneer over the paint and varnish which, while really restoring the finish, actually does so.

Coloring and Surface

Before going into the matter of the labor for needed to restore the finish, it is necessary first to obtain a glimpse into the intricate details of the surface. 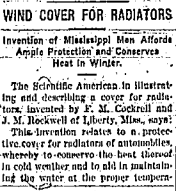

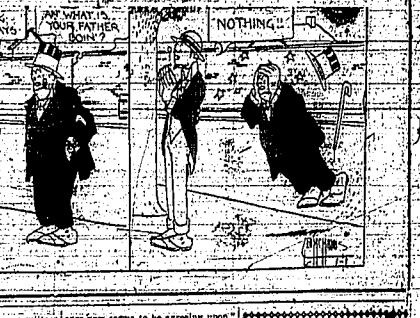
