FORMAL MEETING OF THE REGULATOR-GOVERNORS  
The following is an official copy of the minutes of the meeting which appeared in the Times on the 7th day of January 1919.  
The fact has been determined by the Live Stock Board that the regulations are in force in certain sections of the state. Therefore, in accordance with Section 1165 of the Revised Codes of Idaho and under the authority of the State Live Stock Board, it is hereby

ORDERED, That the following regulations be placed under quarantine until such order is revoked: Best Java, Franklin, Ontario, Cassia, Twin Falls, Goodale, Lincoln, Minidoka, Power, Hancock, Blaineville, Blinghans, Idaho, Camas, Telfer, Jefferson, Madison, Teton, Owyhee, Elmore, Custer, Lemhi and Ada.  
It is further ordered that all sheep found to be infected or exposed in any manner must be dipped according to the regulations of the bureau of animal industry and under the supervision of a state or federal inspector. The following regulations for the movement of sheep within and from the quarantined area will be effective:

The owner or caretaker of sheep located in the quarantined area shall not ship any sheep, but the sheep may move up sheep from the quarantined area from premises therein unless accompanied by an inspection certificate issued by a state or federal inspector covering the sheep to be moved, nor shall any transportation company accept or transport any sheep from the quarantined area unless the shipper first delivers with transportation company the original permit or certificate covering said sheep.

## Quotas For Liberty Loan Given by U. S.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 7.—According to the announcement by Secretary of the Treasury Carter Glass, that the last issue of treasury certificates of indebtedness has been authorized for \$101,500,000, the call for subscribers to a new issue of \$500,000,000, dated January 31, payable July 1, 1920, and drawing interest at 4 1/2 per cent. Bonds will close on the 10th of February 7.

The twelfth federal reserve district's quota is \$14,500,000. This district failed to reach its allotment in the last issue of \$14,000,000. The Chicago district had the largest over-subscription, exceeding its quota by almost \$14,000,000. Minneapolis, St. Louis, Philadelphia and New York also exceeded their allotments.

FORMULA GIVEN FOR THE TREATMENT OF THE DISEASE  
"Many orchard men throughout the county are making inquiries as to the cause of the disease which is attacking their fruit trees. Dr. H. Smith, state university, entomologist, gives the formula of the remedy to be adopted for pear and apple blight.

There is but one remedy known up to the present time and that is the injection of one of the prunning knives and saws. All wounds made by these pruners or saws that show the least signs of the disease should be cut out very soon lest the disease should become epidemic and cause great damage to the orchard. The cut should be made, if possible, a foot below the part affected and the saw or knife should be disinfected with a solution of 10 per cent. of corrosive sublimate, one part to 100 of water. All large wounds should be infested with paraffin to keep out the insects.

## REPORE LIVEN AMERICAN MILK

European dairy people have learned to like American dairy products. "Especially our condensed milk," says a report from 16,000,000 people in 1914 to 2,000,000 people in 1918, and there were notable increases to exports of milk and milk products. This may be due to abnormal war conditions but the United States Department of Agriculture believes that there is both an opportunity and a tendency to expand in this direction over a long period. A normal increase in the dairy industry in this country, therefore, is not only a logical thing, it is a thing that is necessary to increase the level of our dairy products.
