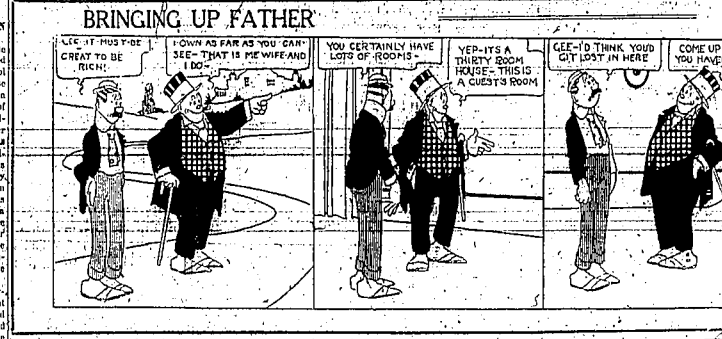

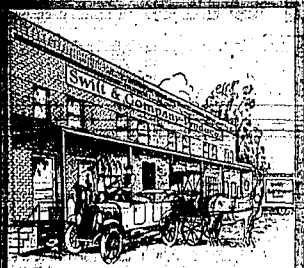

Sweet Tooth Develops in Capital Since Dry

Dandy Merchants Reel in Epigrammatic Sales, but House Not Miserable

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 15.—Washington, already dry by statute, is in training for the days that are to come under the prohibitive amendments now introduced. It is anticipated that the days when the country dry law will be fully effect upon the signing of the new revenue bill by the president. Since the District was made "dry" by congress, it has not been against the law for residents of this district to bring liquor into the city, or to have it, but under the bond dry law, as recently interpreted by the supreme court in a case from West Virginia, this will be forbidden all were members of the diplomatic corps, who may, of course, have liquor on embassy or legation soil; for technicality it is foreign soil.

But in the sixteen months the district has been "dry" the residents who do not wish to go to the trouble of slipping in liquor refreshments have been casting about for substitutes, with results that have been highly satisfactory, although startling to the casual merchant. Most of the old bar rooms have been turned into candy shops or restaurants, and many of the establishments of former years seem which own a great stock of stores throughout the country have put up soda fountains, and also, incidentally, that the regular candy stores have sold a tremendous increased business, according to the druggists who have been asked as to the percentage increase in the men's trade at their stores.

Some of the old stores have made their modified liquor business show the town went "dry," said one candy merchant. "The big store has been compelled to close three bars here. He said that because his stock had been cleaned out. Soldiers are great buyers of candy, and petrolier confectionery stores in the outskirts of the few places that went from "hard" to "soft" drinks when the liquor was banished. Stores that formerly had a few soda fountains are now flooded with soda, who bear no resemblance to "milk-cream" or "hot-milk" or "milk" on the other hand, are "buds." 30 and trappers and hunters of the United States department of agriculture has issued farmers' bulletin 1024, laws relating to fur bearing animals, which is a summary of legislation in the United States, Canada and Newfoundland, relating to trapping, open seasons, propagation, and hunted there, the stipulation that, with a few exceptions, it is illegal to trap or hunt all species of the trapped animals and permanently increase the number of the animals, the federal government, the department of agriculture, should be carefully observed, so that the fur supply of the future shall not be "unduly depleted."

For the fiscal year ended June 30, 1918, the foreign trade of the United States in raw and manufactured furs was valued at \$2,100,000, the largest of the country. While exports were only \$13,500,000 as compared with \$16,728,100 for 1917, the imports were \$23,247,200, as compared with \$21,522,200 for 1917. The total foreign trade in furs increased over 10 per cent.

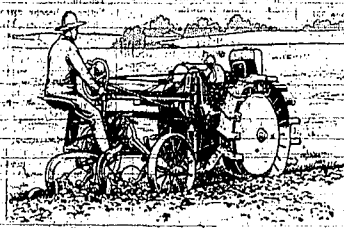

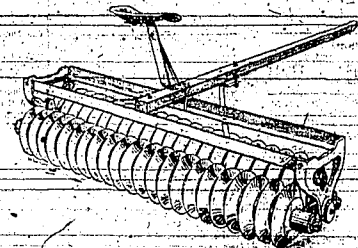
