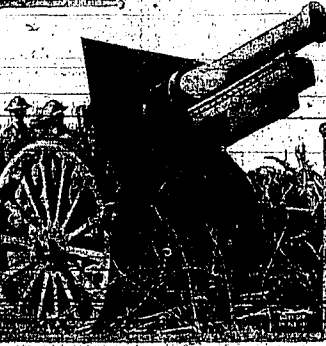

PARIS, Jan. 27 (By Mail)—Operating a one-time French hotel on a "rat" is a "hot" business, day after day, with many fatalities and also many laughs.

French custom, which since has practically continued in effect, is the demand of the traveler, the employer or any other "customer" before depositing his goods or entering the hotel, "It is useless to hark up against this custom, on the contrary, it is the most effective remedy."

Service in the Crillon, however, is not reckoned in terms of France, but in American figures. One American elevator will produce more work and industry in the average French month than a five-franc hotel. The reason for this is that he can not get money that circulates in any way with the American bank, but the traveler has his own "rat" in the form of a certain brand which he will use in the Crillon for about 1919.
