PARIS, Feb. 21. - (By Wireless) - Premier Clemenceau's condi- tion is critical, those of the most eminent specialists in Paris were summoned into consultation on his case today. 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GERMAN LAND TO BE OCCUPIED BY ALLIED ARMIES LONG TIME

Belief Expressed That America Will Finally Yield on This Point - British Statement on Subject Which Reached Paris Today Proposes Joint Occupation by English and Americans as International Army on West Bank of Rhine - Prince Joachim Caught Plotting to Restore His Father to Throne and Is Deported.

PARIS, Feb. 21. - (By Wireless) - It is believed that the American peace delegates would eventually support the suggestion that an international army be kept upon the Rhine as a protection to western Europe against any sudden German attack. The British attitude on the "question of the left bank of the Rhine" published here today, took the form that the German menace will eventually be removed by disarmament under the new armistice terms. But at the same time the view is taken that France must have further safeguards.

BERLIN, Feb. 21. - (By Wire- less) - Prince Joachim, son of the former kaiser, who was arrested at Munich while trying to restore the Hohenzollern dynasty, was deported from Bavaria today. He was escorted to the Prussian frontier by a squad of Bavarian troops. 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FOOTBALL CLAIMS 9 VICTIMS THIS YEAR

Fewer Fatalities' Mark Elimination of Brutality.

All of Victims Were 'Free Lance' Players and Some Had Only Limited Knowledge of Game—'Bad' Training' Says Slagg.

Football, America's great autumn sport, claimed the lives of six players during the 1918 season—three less than the 1917 total—less than in 1916 and seven under the toll of 1915. In 1914 there were 15 deaths.

The dangers of a dozen years ago, when the old style, sampling game, in which the low kicking and vicious offensive tactics, have been almost entirely eliminated by the new style of football play, followers of the game point out.

1. Keep the head steady and do not let the feet turn outward, then the body can only wind up when the arms go back.

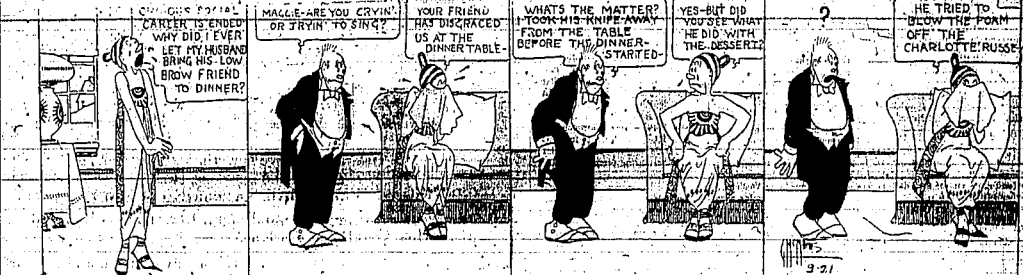
2. Do not swing with the hands and forearms—they are not so well adapted as the other organs for the purpose of striking a ball.
