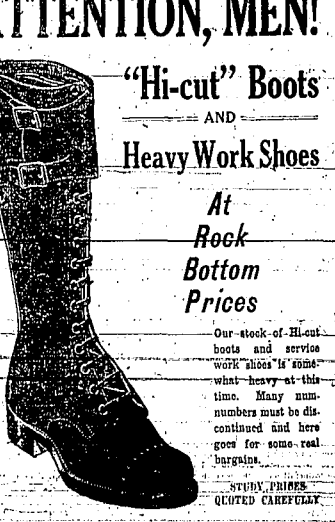

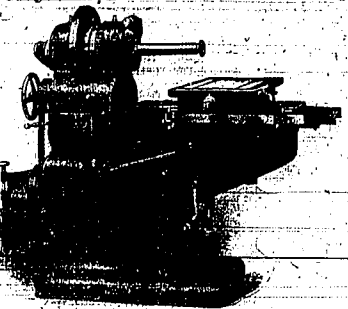

ORCHARD SPRAY SHOULD NOW BE APPLIED SAYS AUTHORITY

Agricultural Department of the Idaho Technical Institute Gives Out Facts of Interest to the People of the State.

February is an important month for spraying. In districts where the graft is still in the trees, the "yellow" disease can be prevented by spraying the trees with Bordeaux mixture. This mixture is made of equal parts of lime and copper sulfate, and is applied in the form of a fine spray.

The date of application of the Bordeaux mixture is important. It should be applied when the trees are in bud, and before the blossoms have opened. This is usually in the first week of February.

The following table shows the recommended amounts of Bordeaux mixture for various types of orchards. For apple orchards, the amount is 20 pounds per acre. For pear orchards, the amount is 15 pounds per acre.
