MOODY ARRESTED AND WILSON SCORED BY DYING LEGISLATURE

BOISE, Mar. 7.—Representative C. S. Moody, former adjutant general of Idaho, faces a criminal charge of "willfully, unlawfully and feloniously" making a false certificate securing the payment of a claim of \$176,000 contracted on a trip to Washington in December of 1918, which has been arrested under a warrant issued on behalf of the court court here for failing to appear.

The arrest is the outgrowth of the investigation made by a legislative investigation committee during the present session. The findings of this committee were to the effect that money from the militia or adjutant general's fund was "illegally and criminally used."

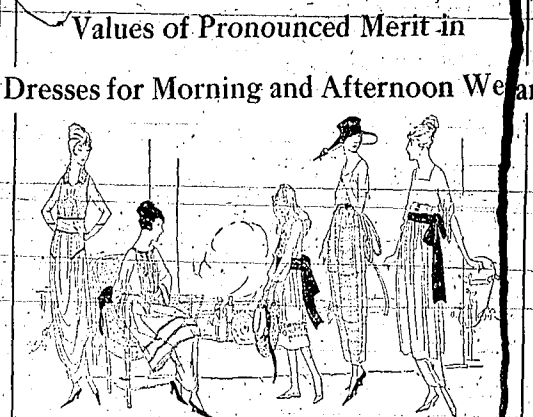

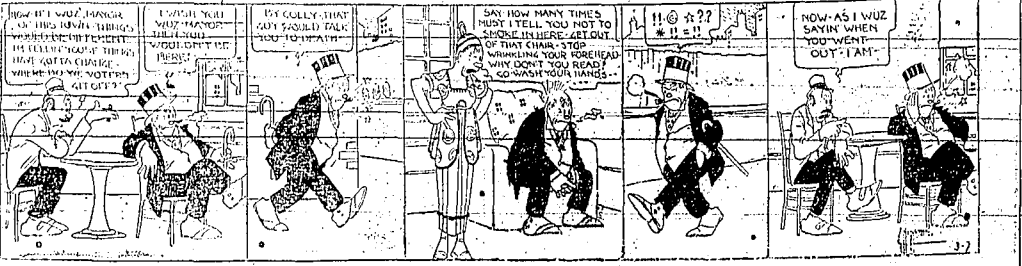
