GRAND JURY REQUESTED FOR THE COUNTY OF TWIN FALLS

Recent Notorious and Public Disregard of Prohibition Laws, Without Prosecution, Belief That Large Quantities of Liquor Are Concealed in the County Which Are Easily Procurable By Those Wishing to Use the Same Are Alleged—Conditions of Serious Kind Said to Have Developed at a Public Trial and Other Serious Law Violations Set Forth.

Petitions asking Judge W. A. Hancock to call a special grand jury to investigate alleged law violations in the county of Twin Falls, Idaho, were presented to the present grand jury at the beginning of its session on Monday morning, March 7, 1919.

TO THE HONORABLE W. A. HANCOCK, JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF THE FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, IN AND FOR TWIN FALLS COUNTY.

The undersigned, your petitioners, respectfully represent your honor that there has recently been open, notorious and public disregard of the prohibition laws of the state of Idaho by the use of public drinking and display of intoxicating liquor within the city of Twin Falls, the county of Twin Falls, although this violation of law has been several weeks ago to the present time, an action without law has been taken by the public officials of the county of Twin Falls to suppress or to any manner to take steps to punish those who have violated said law.

That in addition thereto, that it is publicly reported and is manifest to the county of Twin Falls that there are considerable quantities of intoxicating liquor within the county of Twin Falls, as well as within the city of Twin Falls, which are being sold and distributed by those who are engaged in this trade, and that no steps have been taken to ascertain whether or not these current reports are true, and that the same should be investigated by a grand jury of the county of Twin Falls.

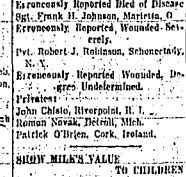

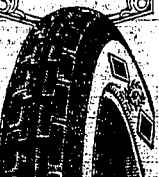

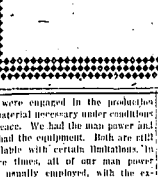

SHIPS FIRST IN FRANCE'S NEEDS

Must Have Aid in Restoring Merchant Marine.

VAST LOSSES SUMMED UP

Edward de Billy, Deputy High Commissioner of the Economic Section of the United States, Gives Statement of Country's Needs—2,500,000 of Her Young Men Killed or Maimed, 25,000 Factories Ruined.

"With 2,500,000 of her youngest, and most spirited men killed or maimed and upward of half her industry and shipping destroyed by the war, France appears to her allies during the final negotiations to be in a position for rebuilding the factories and farms which the Germans wrecked and for assistance in constructing or purchasing new machinery and equipment."

Edward de Billy, deputy high commissioner of the United States, said the country's gain by the conflict in the revivification of the French spirit of self-confidence, sustained by the defeat of 1918, and in the reconstruction and reorganization of her agricultural districts; Mr. de Billy said the war's losses were: 2,500,000 young men killed or maimed; 25,000 factories ruined; 50,000,000,000 francs of property destroyed; 1,500,000,000,000 francs of agricultural production lost; 100,000,000 francs of the money cost of the conflict in transportation and public utility; 1,500,000,000,000 francs, or \$31,000,000,000.

"Our army had to stand," he said, "the first rash of the invasion, while the other armies were being prepared. And, however wonderful was the effort of the British, some months were lost afterward that the American army never recovered from."

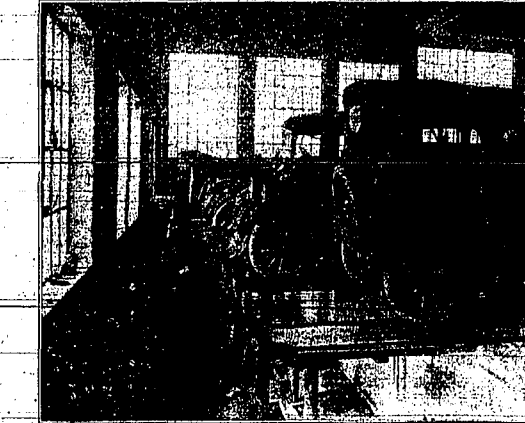
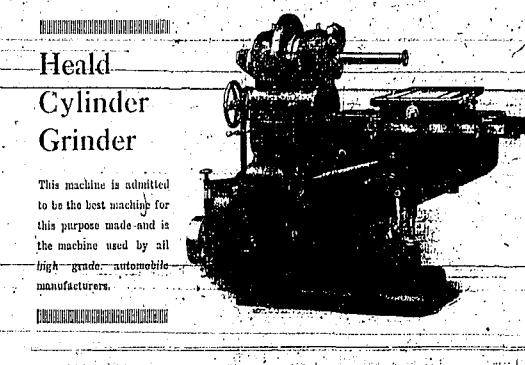
