GOVERNOR PUTS VETO ON BILLS

Two Judicial District Measures With Reverses — Others Are Disapproved—Road Building Approved By Davis

BOISE, Mar. 13.—The two judicial district bills passed by the legislature proposing the creation of the Eleventh district out of Washington and Adams counties, thereby dividing the Seventh district, and the Twelfth district out of Bonner and Boundary counties, met with the disapproval of Governor Davis. He vetoed them. They were commission measures of 400 act providing for the appointment of another judge in the Sixth district, but this bill failed. The Eleventh and Twelfth district bills however were passed to conform with the bill that had been defeated. Both contained no provision relating to the salary of the new judges. This was found by the governor to be unconstitutional.

Disapproval was also given to Senate bill 127 by Road, Nonpartisan which provided for the formation of cooperative associations, and House bill 564 by Hugo and Givens, authorizing county commissioners to conduct financial aid to county convicts of defense.

SERIOUS WHEAT DISEASE IS SPREADING THROUGH IDAHO

Prompt Action of Farmers Necessary to Prevent Spread of Loose Smut, a New Disease of Wheat in Southern Idaho.

Loose smut, a serious wheat disease, is rapidly gaining a foothold in southern Idaho. The symptoms of this disease is shown by leaves turning yellow. In our county alone, in Idaho in 1918, this disease caused a loss of over 100,000 bushels of wheat. Loose smut must not be confused with Blue or Rinking smut. The spores of Rinking smut are found in the outside of the wheat grain, consequently treatment by formaldehyde or copper sulfate kills the spores. For Rinking smut, the following formaldehyde treatment is most generally used:

1. Clean seed thoroughly with fine mill and half fill sacks with cleaned grain, trim end securely.
2. Pour one pound (plus) of a 4 per cent solution of formaldehyde in a bagged sack, containing about 40 gallons of water. Mix thoroughly.
3. Dip in formaldehyde solution for 10 minutes, fermenting sack at end of first five minutes to make sure that entire surface of each kernel is wet.
4. Drain sacks well, allowing excess to drain back into barrel.
5. Spread sacks out to dry. Grain can be drilled following morning. It may be drilled after drainage well, providing the seed bed is in a moist condition and allowance is made to plant enough more of the partially swollen grain to get a full seeding.

Loose smut of wheat will be first recognized in the field by noting that in places of the normal wheat stalks, there appear masses of black powder (spores) on the ends of the white heads.

This black powder is known to the healthy plants and infests internally the growing wheat. No symptoms are shown on the outside of the wheat grain, consequently the external formaldehyde or copper sulfate treatment has no effect. A treatment necessary to prevent will penetrate to the inside of the grain, kill the disease, and at the same time will injure the remaining power of the wheat seed. Such chemicals are secreted by the use of the modified Jensen but water treatment as follows:

1. The grain is soaked in cold water for a period of four or five hours; next, it is treated in water containing 12 1/2 percent of formaldehyde for 10 minutes.
2. If the temperature of the water is much higher, or if the grain is treated for a longer period, the treatment may be shortened.
3. After the grain is treated, it can be "drilled" after drainage well, providing the seed bed is in a moist condition and allowance is made to plant enough more of the partially swollen grain to get a full seeding.

SEX WAR OPENS WITH CONTESTS TO RETAIN JOB

Cleveland Street Car Conductor Cases Offers Test of Right of Women to Compete With the Men

WASHINGTON, Mar. 13.—The first gun in what some call the "coming war of the sexes" was fired here by the national war labor board this afternoon when women conductors of Cleveland pleaded with hooded men for recognition as equals.

Frank P. Wash appeared as attorney for the women, and Dr. Anita Howard Shaw, honorary president of the National Women's Suffrage Association, was a witness. The women also were represented by Mrs. Laura Prince, president of the Cleveland war labor board, Mrs. Muriel G. Cleveland.

This was the first hearing on the merits of the conductors' case, and the decision involves women's fundamental right to work in occupations with men. The Cleveland women, employed by the street railway company at the same wage as the men, with the same hours, same rules and same responsibilities. When men were refused to admit the women to their union, and went on strike to force the company to disown them, they were charged with insubordination and sent to the "volunt" to suffer and end the strike.

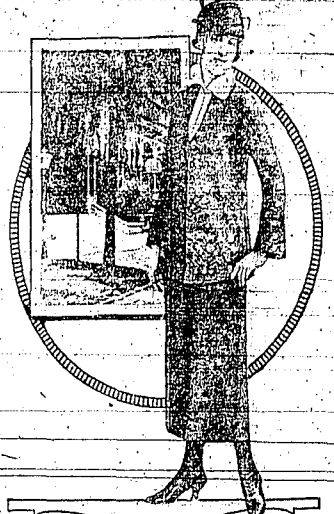

At Düsseldorf, which has long been a storm center, the revolution was suppressed by government troops and military and machine guns.

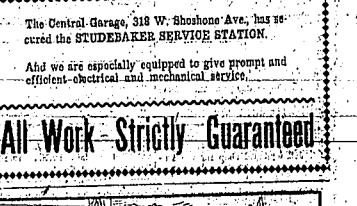
