

SHORTAGE OF HOUSES HERE IS ALARMING

CITY UNABLE TO CARE FOR THOSE WHO CAME HERE SEEKING HOME

Realty Men Estimate 50 to 150 Houses Short

Daily Stream of House Builders in Twin Falls Mostly Carrying Building Locations Elsewhere—Building Boom May Bring Relief.

Twin Falls is suffering from growing pains. That the demand for rental houses at the present time ranges from fifty to one hundred is well known and that many good permanent citizens are daily being lost to the community on account of this distressing shortage is the information gathered from various real estate dealers of the city.

Each day there are from one to two dozen home-seekers who wander from town to town, and they are not here to stay. If they are able to make shift without the houses they may or may not do so, if not they will go to some other town.

Special salesmen interested by The Daily Times were of one opinion as to the housing situation. They agree that the supply of houses is very short, but most of them feel that relief is in sight with prospects of a boom in building this spring and summer. It is felt that probably the craze of building costs will protect a campaign of construction. If this expectation should fail of realization the city will be in a worse predicament than now, as the road roads building and municipal improvements are bound to bring more people to the community.

"We could easily fill fifty houses," he said. "If there were that many new houses built they could be filled now. The reason why they are not being built, or, because labor and other material, as well as labor, has been high and prices are writing for a drop. I do not believe that coming down, at least not until prices come down, but I understand that there will be a terrific boom in building."

The work in good roads will increase the demand for houses. There will probably be a hundred less than the demand, this summer if not next season.

George Dean of the Exchange Hotel company, stated that there are at least two dozen calls a day for houses in the city. He said that he has received and necessarily received every day, he said.

"I know of one man yesterday who went to find a house here. The situation is very unfortunate."

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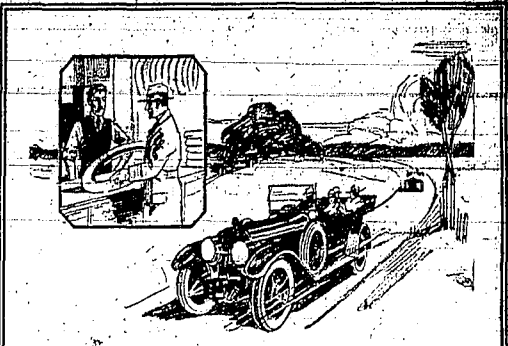
