NOTES FROM THE UNIVERSITY WORK AND PLAY AT MOSCOW

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, MOSCOW, March 21.—All students of the university must register for their third quarter's work before the end of examination week...

Regular classes of the third college term will commence Monday, March 24. In order that all students may start as scheduled it is necessary that all registration for the third quarter be completed before the students leave their homes...

Students will start registering by depositing their registration fee with the appointed A. S. U. representative in the bureau's office...

Last quarter's credits will be determined on the basis of this quarter's grades in the cases where the instructor was not sure of the standard of the students' work.

According to Dean H. E. Hildard, some of the professors turned in credits at the end of the first quarter, but only in those cases where there was some question of checking over the work...

LIABILITY IS ISSUE OF SUIT

Contractor Sues Insurance Company Which He Charges Failed to Defend or Protect Him From Losses in Liability Suit

C. H. Mull, bridge contractor, of Twin Falls, today began action against the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company, which he charges failed to defend or protect him from losses in liability suit.

Mull's complaint alleges that in November, 1917, he took out the policy for one year. At the time he was building bridges in this county.

On March 29 one of his employees, Art Lawson, was injured when a heavy steel girder fell upon him and was eventually awarded \$240.00 damages.

Lawson refused to defend the suit or to cover losses \$6,000, but in the following June Mull demanded on Mull for the premium payment, \$125.00.

The complaint recites Mull's experience of the suit to be \$250 damages, attorney fees, and costs for litigation to the amount of \$3,200.25.

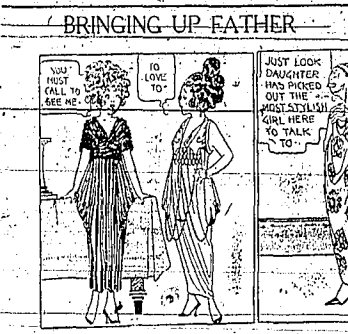

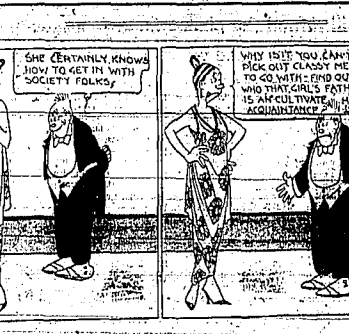
