

WARNS FARMERS TO HEED DANGER SIGNAL OF VANISHING LIVESTOCK

J. W. Jones, Department of Agriculture Beet Expert, Declares Future of Farm Life Rests On Keeping Human Side in View—Custav Kunze Gives Strong Arguments for Silo as Factor in Feeding.

Minidoka and Twin Falls county farmers, gathered at the local farm bureau last evening, heard their well-drawn and convincing arguments of the present and future for the man who must wrest his living from the soil. But whether dissipating or satisfying their was illuminating information, the fruit of scientific study and long practical experience, which every attentive listener will have enjoyed.

Mr. Jones, who is well known to the Twin Falls county, and who is in charge of the Idaho Department of Agriculture, Gustav Kunze, of Pullman, president of the Idaho Dairyman's association; E. P. Rihm, chief field animal husbandman for Idaho; J. C. Handy, president of the Minidoka county farm bureau; S. H. Kayler, Clyde Anderson and other Twin Falls county and other farm bureau officers, discussed general farm problems and in particular the important relations of the silo to stock feeding.

An urgent warning was thrown out by J. W. Jones regarding what he termed "the coming war" between the silo and the stock. The increasing tendency to neglect livestock production in connection with farming and to neglect the silo as a factor in stock raising is a danger signal that must not be ignored, he declared. This tendency is shown, he said, in the fact that crops which are produced for the preservation or maintenance of soil fertility, and in allowing land values to go so high that the young farmer must break away from the farm.

Best or other crops, he said; must be tied in with the livestock industry, and the maintenance of soil fertility. It is a grave error to allow the stock to vanish from the farm. Proper rotation of crops with plowing for the stock is the best way to build up the soil, he stated. As an example of inefficient farming, it is no longer merely a question of having lots of muck, but it is a matter of making it into a fertilizer. Mr. Kunze told how the silo was brought in when it first appeared, and how it was necessary to overcome some prejudices not always recognized in the livestock industry.

Standards Covering Women's Work Is Approved By Sec.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 28.—The first step toward the solution of the women in industry problem has been announced by the department of labor. After careful investigation and delving into all sides of the exigent conditions of the department, the secretary has issued the following standards:

- 1. An eight-hour day not more than forty-eight hours for any one week.
2. Half holiday on Saturday.
3. One day of rest in seven.
4. At least three-quarters of an hour for meals.

A rest period of ten minutes should be allowed in the middle of each working period without thereby increasing the length of the working day.

No woman shall be employed before the hours of 10 p. m. and 6 a. m.

Women doing light work shall not receive the same wages as men doing the same work.

Wages should be paid for a woman at least for the time she is engaged in the production of goods.

The wage rate should be based upon the difference in production for a woman as a whole, and not determined arbitrarily.

Wages should be established on the basis of occupation and not on the basis of sex.

Wages should cover the cost of living for the dependents and not the minimum for the individual.

These standards are the result of a program that will tend to protect the health of women, protect at work, and insure the best conditions of work.

These standards for women work have the approval of the secretary of labor, who, it is believed, will embody them in his recommendations to congress when it comes to the making of this problem.
