TANKS TO PLAY LARGE PART IN NEXT BIG WAR

Opinion of British Army Officer That Future Wars Will Have More Machines and Fewer Men.

LONDON, March 25.—Tanks as an implement of war will not be abandoned by Great Britain. The value of these moving forts of steel, which played such an important part in breaking the Hindenburg line, is regarded as great, but a committee of experts of the government tank branch has been organized by the war office to supervise all tank activities.

Experiments will be carried on in hopes of improving the "whippers" and the gas carrying type.

Officials of the war office realize that an army of 50,000 men, equipped with tanks and airplanes could easily defeat a force of 100,000 without tanks.

The fact, as officers will record in the history of the present war made the following prediction today:

"In any future war we shall never have the quality armies of men, with the masses of supplies which can be so easily bombed, and need miles of communication lines, always liable to cut.

It is felt that we shall have comparatively small armies of men with numbers of mechanical appliances of tanks, airplanes and artillery which will be the most important factors.

"We are now striving to develop more speed and mobility in our tanks. We do not think the future tank will be much bigger than those we have now. For the bigger the tank the bigger is the target offered.

"It is confidently hoped that tanks will be constructed with a speed of twenty-five miles an hour over dry roads.

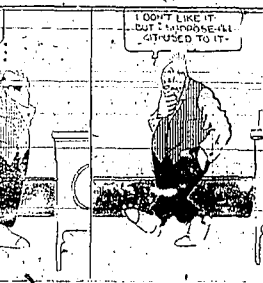
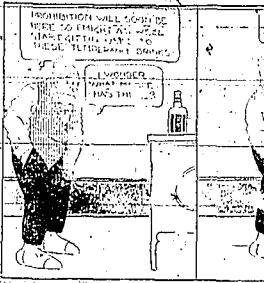

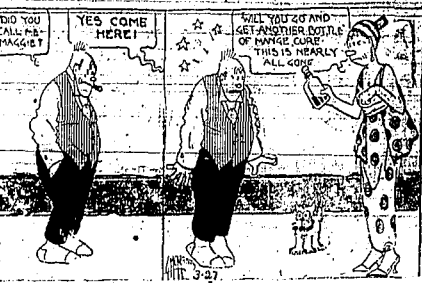

3.—Complete military neutralization of the Ruhr of the Rhine and of the Moselle.
4.—A money payment in excess of \$100,000,000.
