WHO WON FIRST 'C' CLAIMS

GAZE LIFE IN WAR

LONDON, April 6.—London papers are conducting a spirited investigation to discover who won the first Victoria Cross in the war and who was the first Briton to be awarded in defense of civilization.

During an investigation of war honors the King at Buckingham Palace a few days ago an officer of the Royal Fusiliers raised the interesting question. He advanced the claim of Private Arthur Gaze of the Royal Fusiliers, as the first winner; of the highly coveted decoration. But G. A. Gaze, who has written a book, "The Heroes of the War," comes forward with the assertion that Godley might have laid claim to being the first Victoria Cross winner.

Mr. J. Deane, of the same regiment, who afterward died of wounds, received during the retreat from Mount St. Eloi.

"In point of time the first five V. C. heroes of the war were: Lieutenant M. J. James (Royal Fusiliers), Corporal C. E. Godley (15th Hussars), Private H. F. Gifford (Royal Fusiliers), Lance Corporal C. A. Jarvis (Royal Fusiliers), and Captain Theodore Wright (Royal Engineers).

"Five more carried their crosses on the first day of actual fighting, namely, August 23, 1914. It is curious that two—Godley and Godley—were prisoners in Germany until last year.

"What has been decided in determining who was actually the first V. C. of the war, is who died actually racked during that memorable day? Godley won his at Hazebrouk and Jarvis his at Jemappes; the other three won theirs at Mons. Therefore, as the fighting at Mons was the fiercest and Jarvis was ruled out. Therefore Deane, Godley and Wright.

"The fact was his cross for attempting to demolish a bridge, presumably when the retreat had been ordered, as to delay the German advance. Deane and Godley won the coveted cross for working their machine guns. Arthur Gaze's was performed at the battle of Mons during the thick of the fighting, both are entitled to the status of being the first V. C. of the war. Private Godley will not mind showing his cross to Godley, but Godley, who has the great sacrifice, for he died of his wounds.

"He has been unanimously decided that the first fighter in the British force to be wounded was Sergeant Major Jillette of the Royal Air Force, who was hit by an aircraft while making a reconnaissance flight on August 22, 1914, the day before the heroic battle of Mons.

"Among his list the double honor of being the first Briton wounded and the first man in the air force to be hit.

CONDITIONS GOVERN ALL MEAT COSTS

Packer Says Prices Vary According to Demand—Not Fair to Take Local Prices of One Out as Basis

CHICAGO, April 5.—Why should a sirloin steak that cost the consumer only 28 cents a pound in Minneapolis not cost here the same thing? The sirloin steaks with wide variations have been these prices.

Consumers are asking the question in view of statistics that presented by the United States department of labor.

The difference in price is explained by a representative of Armour and Company, on these grounds: The differentials are back-of-the-house differentials, which may be due to the fact that certain brands, the quality of the meat, the style of trim and cut, and market conditions.

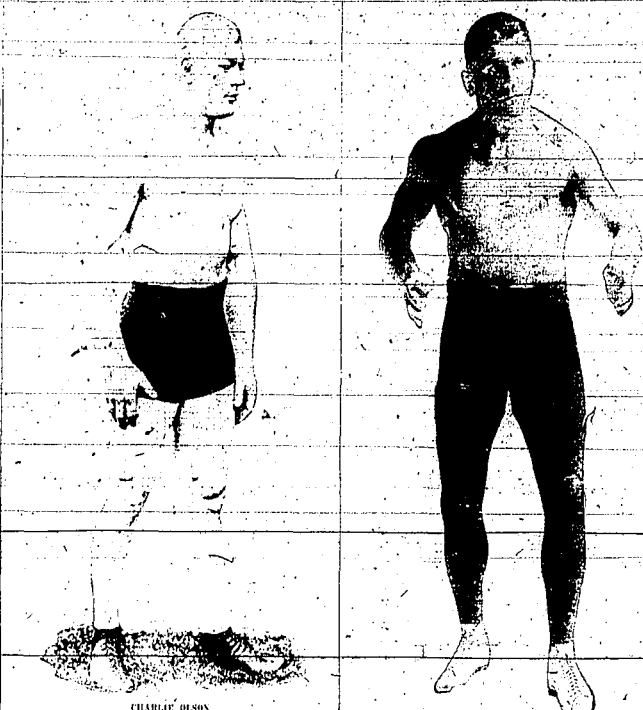
