

INDUSTRIAL ROUND TABLE FOR SOLVING PROBLEMS, LEADING TO UNNECESSARY STRIKES

LONDON, April 7.—(By the way, this period of widespread unrest for the good of the good name which it secured for itself during the war.) This conduct ought not to diminish the reputation built upon the laboring services rendered by laboring men.

Australian Workers' Lot Is Better Than That of Europeans

MELBOURNE, Australia (By mail).—An interesting comparison between Australian and French labor and living conditions was made by Commissioner Thomson, of the French mission to Australia, previous to his departure for the United States. Commissioner Thomson stated, to begin with, that the condition of the Australian worker was preferable to that of the worker of any European country. The reason for that, he said, was the universal application of the eight-hour day. Part of the answer to the conditions of European labor is the fact of a uniform international working day. In England, for example, the day of labor may mean anything from eight to twelve hours.

The commissioner pointed out that wages in Australia were generally much higher than in France and most of Europe, with the exception that the highly skilled laborer received more in France than in Australia. It appeared to M. Thomson that the Australian worker was better housed and better dressed than the French worker, and that was due to the fact that taxation does not fall so heavily on the Australian working class as it does upon the French.

Regarding food, the commissioner thought the Frenchman had his advantage, despite the high price current in France. This is because the French has legislative power far more than possessed by Australian states, as compared with France.

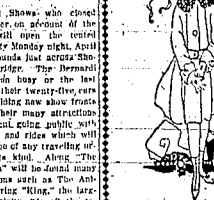

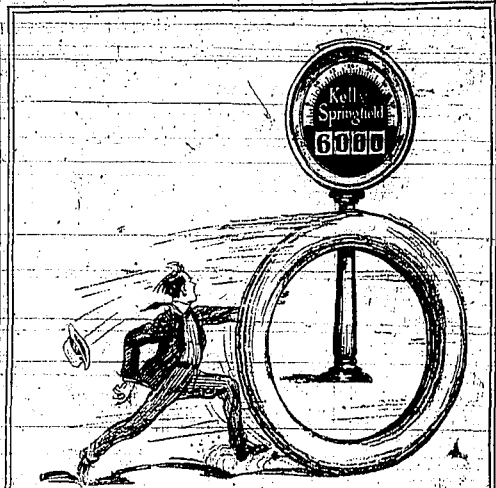
