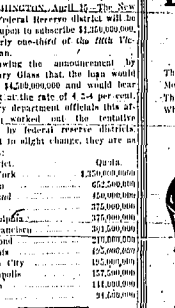

PROGRESS OF SUFFRAGE

The first suffrage granted to American women was the right of Kentucky, which as early as 1875 granted women the right to vote at school elections. The first state to grant full suffrage was Wyoming in 1890. Many years went by without much progress after the Wyoming action. Minnesota, New Hampshire and Massachusetts followed Kentucky into limited suffrage covering school and tax collections, but it was not until 1893 that full suffrage was granted by Colorado. Three years afterward, in 1896, Idaho and Utah granted full suffrage to women.

The action in Utah was predicated on the old fight between Mormons and Gentiles. The Mormon had figured it out that votes for women would give them a preponderance of political strength, their being at that time many more Mormon women than Gentile women. The Gentile population was made up largely of miners and prospectors, while the Mormons were home builders, so that fast land was granted to suffrage in Utah.

Forty-two years after Idaho and Utah granted the right, Washington entered the column of states with full suffrage. Nearly every year since then has seen extension of the principle. Washington's law was taken by Idaho, California, 1911, Kansas, Arizona and Oregon, 1912, Montana and Nevada, 1913, Utah, 1913, Colorado, 1913, Arizona and Nevada, 1913, Montana and South Dakota, 1918. Arkansas granted primary suffrage which is considered virtually equal to full suffrage in 1917, and Texas followed in 1918.

Presidential suffrage was made operative in Illinois in 1913. Kentucky, Rhode Island and North Dakota, 1915; and Vermont, Wisconsin, Indiana, Maine, Minnesota and Missouri in 1916. The twenty-seven states in which women have had presidential suffrage covered over one-half of the electoral college vote for all of the United States, 45 per cent of the womanhood, and nearly half the states in presidential campaigns.

The progress of enfranchising women represents the progress of civilization. America, however, is not alone in recognizing women as qualified to hold an opinion in political matters. The Isle of Man granted suffrage to women in 1851; New Zealand in 1893; Australia in 1902; Finland in 1906; Norway in 1907; Iceland in 1913; Denmark in 1915; Lithuania in 1917; Poland, Austria, Czechoslovakia, England, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Finland, Scotland and Wales in 1918; Holland and Sweden in 1919.

The large number of nations in the list since the world war indicates recognition in these countries of the sterling character of their women, and an appreciation of the work done by women during the world's most trying war period.

SETTLING DIFFERENCES

Salem, Ore., has an ambition to become a strifeless city, and it seems to be proceeding in the way to accomplish that result. It is a model city in the sense that it has no strikes. The settlement of all differences between employers and employees can be settled by mediation. Organized labor and organized capital are going to gether, and those institutions which have been running without organizations are being watched thru by educational committees to show them the error of their way.

It need hardly be pointed out that Bolshevism finds its recruits from among the unorganized laborers, and the incentive toward Bolshevism is usually furnished by unorganized capital, which holds it self superior to the common run of humanity. By organization the world has moved forward industrially. Without organization, every body for himself and the devil take the hindmost, this poor old world would still be roasting in the woods and wilds for enough to eat.

It is refreshing to find a community starts out on a campaign for further organization, when the complaints of both employer and employee may be investigated and differences settled by the usual method of applying brains to the problem. Salem is a model city if it doesn't watch out a place where everybody works and enjoys the fruits of his labor. What could be a more desirable situation to have in a Christian land?

Base ballers say there never was such a mass of correspondents coming to Idaho, from newspaper, business men and manufacturers. They all want to know more about Idaho, simply because they have learned the fact that Idaho is alive. People generally want to go into live countries, and if fortune smiles upon the Peachtree fight boosters, and the team is handed for that city, the publicity which will come from the affair will do much toward making Idaho more famous.

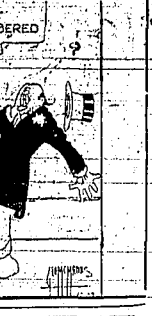

**College Advises
As to Oat Smut**

FULLMAN, Wash., April 15—(U. P.)—The most conspicuous cause of this class which prevails upon the grain crop of America, but which in the year of the United States' entry in the world war destroyed more wheat than it fed one million cavalry horses, is the subject of a letter for review by George A. Zundel, and distributed among the county agricultural agents of Washington as a help in the spring warfare which will be made upon this type of smut.

The anti-smut campaign of the approaching season of grain-planting will in Washington be headed by Mr. Zundel who is acting for the U. S. department of agriculture and the extension service of the state college. His warning to oat growers is based on knowledge of heavy losses which they are suffering, many of them unaware because of the inconspicuous nature of oat smut. He says that most of the smutted heads are short, that many farmers are raising from 5 per cent to 20 per cent of smut every year with no knowledge of this fact.

The two methods of treatment for oat smut which Mr. Zundel says from all data available are deemed to be best are:

1. Use one pint of formaldehyde to 40 gallons of water. Spread the seed out on a canvas or on a floor and sprinkle at the rate of one gallon of solution to each bushel of oats. Thoroughly mix with a shovel so that all of the seed becomes thoroughly wet. Tie the bag and cover overnight (or 12 hours) with sterilized canvas or heavy paper. Puncture out vent openings and allow the gas to escape.
2. Using the same kind of a solution, dip the seed into the solution for ten minutes. Then drain and allow the seed to remain in the wet sacks overnight (12 hours). Then spread the seed out to dry, or seed at once. Never pile up sacks of wet oats treated with formaldehyde. It allows the gas to work too long which eventually kills the seed.
