MUSICIAN MUST HAVE RELIGION ELSE HE BE MERE TECHNICIAN

America will not produce a truly great musician until she has found herself as a religious nation, it said Duke Ellington, the violinist, in a recent interview at the University of Idaho.

"By religious, I do not mean to use the term in the narrow sense, religion is, after all, a sense of enthusiasm for great things; it is a sense of some kind of divinity. We Americans as a nation do not have that spirit."

The "great artist must both think and feel. He must be religious in much of it. But more than technique, he needs understanding of the heart of humanity. It is very difficult to be both of these. My own training is perhaps typical.

"I began studying the violin when I was eight years old. I lived in Illinois where my father was an educator. I went to school six hours a day and practiced four hours after that."

"By the time I was twelve, I should be acquainted with all literature. He should have played all of the big sonatas and concertos. He should have developed the technique that he is now using."

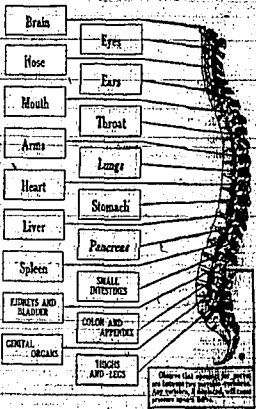
