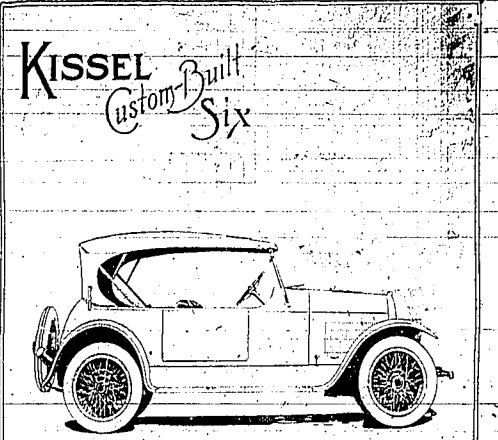

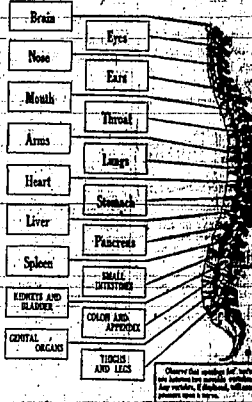

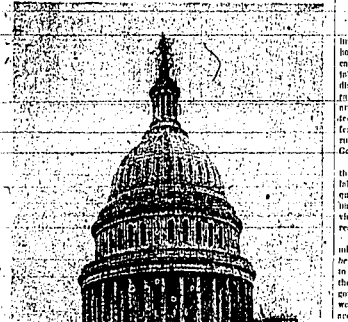

Committee Composed of British Employers and Employed Made Suggestive Recommendations.

Recommendations that a legal basis should be made for industrial peace, subject to variation in proper cases with adequate safeguards, are included. That systematic overtime be discouraged and that legal limit wages rates be maintained (applicability to fixed rates is not the subject of a committee report) are also included. In London, in February at the request of Premier Lloyd George.

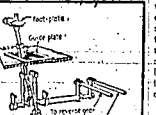

"Why, I cannot I mean I have," said Bob, "and I suppose," finished Anne sarcastically, but smiling at the confusion.

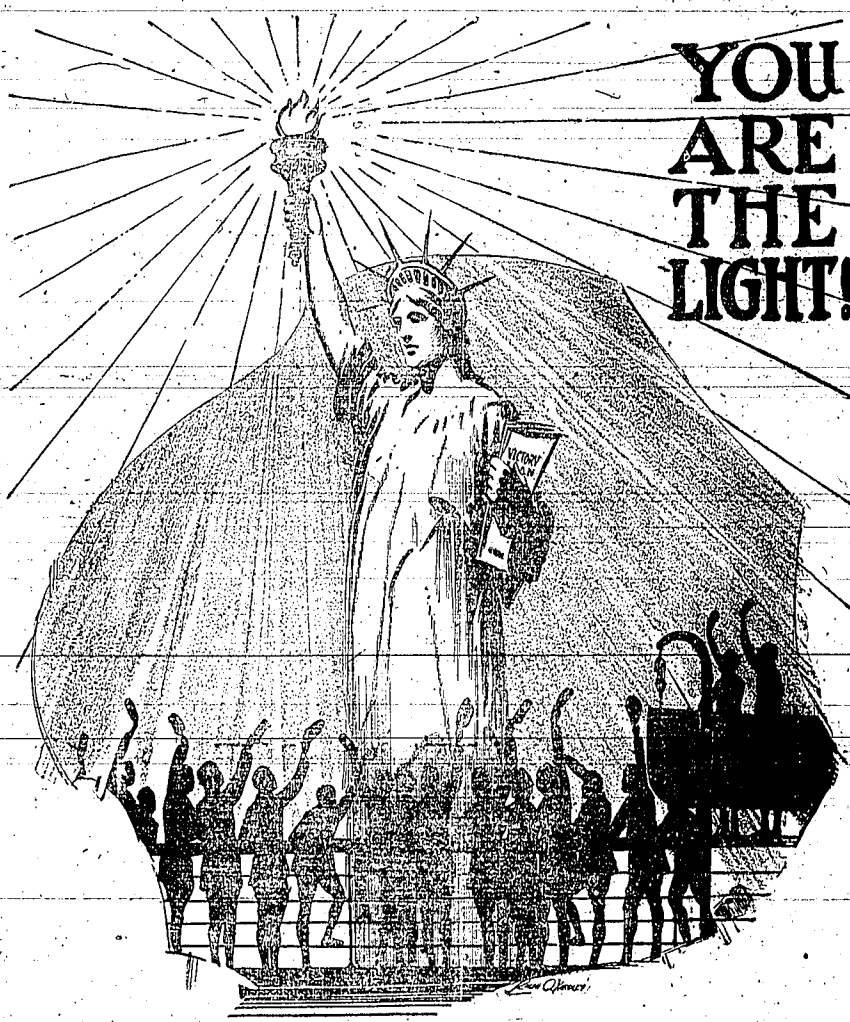
"No, I haven't, that is not yet," said Bob, recovering himself a little, "but I did come to—uh, hang it all, Anne, will you marry me?"
