WEDNESDAY IS VICTORY LOAN HALF-HOLIDAY

GOVERNOR ASKS PEOPLE TO DEVOTE ENTRIES TO RAISING QUOTA Fifty Per Cent Is Now Subscribed One Big Pull Together Will Put Idaho Over Top, and Half-Holiday Will Give Opportunity to Keep State's Record Clear.

BOISE, May 6.—With fifty per cent of the \$11,500,000 raised, Idaho faces the first week of the Victory Loan campaign. Despite the short time remaining, which is now spent the state's full allotment, State Chairman Monte B. Dixon insists that the state believe Idaho will subscribe her entire quota by Wednesday night.

Throughout the entire state an intense effort is being made. Every county not yet in standing is being urged to make the grade on time. Governor D. W. Davis today issued the following proclamation designating Wednesday afternoon a legal holiday to enable all business people to concentrate their energies on the loan drive.

"There is no need that a united effort be made if Idaho is to keep the quota of Victory money allotted to the citizens of this state and their duty by the national government. We have been asked to subscribe for our share of this patriotic obligation. Approximately 50 per cent of this amount has been subscribed."

"This Idaho should fall in this Victory loan drive and thus bear an irreproachable record of loyalty and devotion to America, both in the gift of money and in the gift of time. It is the duty of every citizen to contribute his share of this patriotic obligation. Approximately 50 per cent of this amount has been subscribed."
