GERMANS ARE PLOTTING REVOLUTION

Big Business Interests Have Copies Of Peace Treaty, But Senate Denied Privilege of Examining It, Is Charge

HITCHCOCK ANSWERS FOUL INSINUATIONS

Calls Up Legislation to Investigate Allegation That Wall Street Was in Possession of Peace Treaty, and Alleges Practitioners and State Department From It

WASHINGTON, June 5.—Republican senator Charles Hitchcock today charged that copies of the peace treaty had been in the possession of Wall Street "and allegedly insinuated" that the president possessed knowledge that the document had reached certain American financial interests.

Hitchcock provoked a storm today when he called up his resolution providing for a special probe of the allegations of Senator Lodge of Massachusetts, the senate majority leader, and Senator Dorn, progressive author of the widely discussed proposed amendments to the original league of nations covenant.

The senator's charge entered upon a defense of the president and attacked the state department of all states for any "leakage."

WINNIPEG STRIKE IS TIGHTENED

Following Counter-Demonstrations by Several Hundred Soldiers Strikers Call Out More

WINNIPEG, Man., June 5.—Following a counter-demonstration yesterday by several hundred soldiers, recently returned from overseas, the central strike committee, in charge of the general strike here since May 15 today issued orders for a "general tightening up" in the line of the strikers.

The strike committee called out all street wagon drivers, stopped all library of ice and closed several restaurants and motoring picture theatres.

Following the demonstration against the strike yesterday, strikers and citizens opposing the strike met in a public meeting at the Y. M. C. A. building.

The demonstration by anti-striker yesterday was orderly, the demonstrators' speeches were well received and other parts of the strike and marching to parliament buildings were postponed the government to take "immediate action" to deport "undesirable aliens" and to arrest the agitators, declaring that previous demonstrations of religious society did not represent the true sentiment of the soldiers of the strike.

BALTIMORE VERDICT DOESN'T HURT GAME

Revolutionary Changes Not Forced, Only Hurried.

The game itself is no different today than it has ever been. The fact that a jury has ordered the owners that they pay the Baltimore Federal a few thousand dollars has not hurt baseball as a sport and what was first looked upon as a body blow by a great many followers of baseball affairs is now be-

ing considered as a mere incident in the rather eventful history of the game.

President John A. Hoyle, of the National league is of this opinion. He does not believe that the decision of a jury can possibly retard the development of the pastime and he predicts a highly successful comeback for the game.

Just as long as the competitive game is maintained on the same basis, he has characterized it for so many years, baseball will thrive. The fact that the Federal league is being kept about the business side of the game has often been demonstrated.

The new order of things which President Ben Johnson of the American league predicts and which President Hoyle's success may come to pass, will probably work a benefit rather than a hurt to the business in the long run.

As baseball is now constituted, the player contract, with the reserve clause, the draft law and the agreement between leagues—stands as its backbone. For despite the supposed elimination of the national league, the minor leagues are still affiliated with the majors officially.

The fact that a club can keep one ball player as long as it chooses to do so is not the reason for the fact that baseball will be about all that baseball will need in the way of a change.

There is no need for dissolving the national compact because of the Baltimore verdict.

"Don'ts" for Prevention of Forest Fires Issued by American Forestry Association

WASHINGTON, June 6.—The time to stop the forest fires is right now, says an announcement from the American Forestry Association, which is not having any. The fire in Minnesota last year is still fresh in the public mind and when it is estimated that the loss in timber was \$25,000,000 and that \$400,000 acres were burned, every precaution should be taken by summer campers, says the association, which is getting contributions from all over the country to help in its work of refencing the devastated areas of France and Belgium.

Here are some don'ts that should be posted up on every tent-door flap:

1. Don't throw your matches away until you are sure it is out.
2. Don't drop cigarette or cigar stubs until the slow is extinguished.
3. Don't knock out pipe ashes until you are sure they are not inflammable material.
4. Don't build a camp fire against a tree, a log, or a stump, or anywhere but on bare soil.
5. Don't build a camp fire any larger than is absolutely necessary.
6. Don't leave a fire until you are sure it is out. If necessary, another with earth or water.
7. Don't burn brush or refuse in or near the woods if there is any chance that the fire may spread beyond your control, or that the wind may carry sparks where they would start a new fire.
8. Don't let any more careless fire with fire in the woods than you are sure to your own home.
9. Don't be false when you discover a fire in the woods. If you can't put it out yourself, get help. When a forest guard, ranger, or a state fire warden can be reached call him up on the nearest telephone you can find.

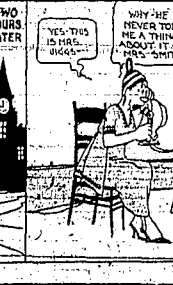
