THREE MEET DEATH IN AUTO COLLISION AT MOUNTAIN HOME

Oregon Man Blamed by Coroner's Jury for Crash That Killed Him, His Bride and Another Woman

(By The Associated Press) MOUNTAIN HOME, Idaho, Sept. 2.—Wellington R. Rose of Lebanon, Ore., 34-year-old former New York City newspaperman, was blamed tonight by an Elmore county coroner's jury for an automobile collision near here that brought quick death today to himself, his wife and another woman.

The other dead was Mrs. Fern Rose, 31, of Lebanon, Ore. Rose's wife, a year and Mrs. Katherine Wilson, of Chemawa, Ore., employee of the Chemawa Indian school.

Both received broken skulls, Rose's skull being crushed. E. R. Mason, 45, husband of Mrs. Mason, and an instructor in forestry in the Chemawa Indian school were not injured.

Instant death. The three persons who were killed died instantly when the east-bound Rose car collided head-on with a west-bound machine seven miles east of here on the Oregon trail.

Both automobiles captured late tonight were demolished. The three dead came to their deaths in an automobile collision between an automobile on the west-bound side of the highway, the jury concluded.

Among the persons at the inquest was Mrs. Myrtle E. Rose of Boise, Idaho, sister of Rose, who was a close friend of the parents of Mr. and Mrs. Rose when they resided at (Continued on Page 2, Col. 1)

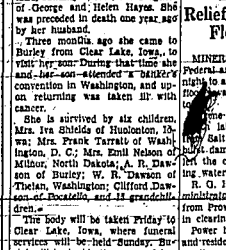

ACT HELD INVALID**

Federal Judge C. C. Cavanah Rules in Lewiston Bankruptcy Case

BOISE, Sept. 3 (AP)—Federal District Judge C. C. Cavanah in an order that took effect today declared that the Fraser-Lemke farm mortgage moratorium act, as amended by the 74th congress, is unconstitutional.

The amended act violates the fifth amendment of the federal constitution "in that it deprives the creditor of property rights without due process of law," the judge ruled. The original Fraser-Lemke act was also held unconstitutional on May 10, 1925, by Judge Cavanah and his opinion was sustained by the United States supreme court.

Already in federal district courts have held the amended law unconstitutional and four have declared it unconstitutional, court attaches recalled.

The judge's ruling today came in a bankruptcy case started by Mark Maynard, former near Lewiston. Maynard agreed to purchase a farm from Robert J. Gill for \$30,000 in 1928; \$7,254 remains due and unpaid on the contract after two extensions on that amount; there also was a delinquent \$7,812 mortgage payable to the Federal Land bank at Spokane, Wash.
