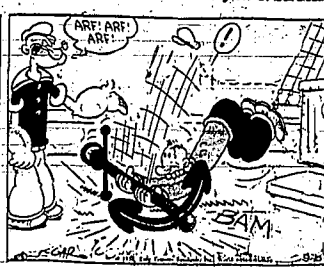

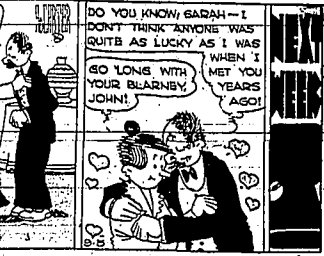

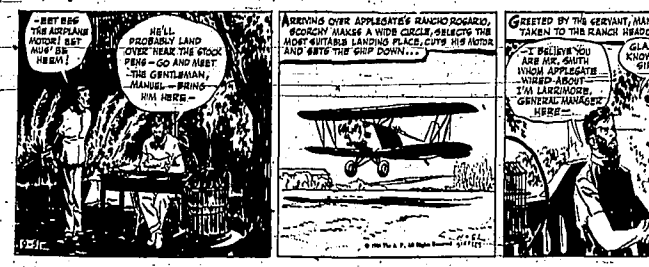

FORMER RESIDENTS TRAGEDY'S VICTIMS

W. B. Behears and Wife Found Dead in Parked Car at Denver

Former Twin Falls residents, William B. Behears, 60, electrical appliance salesman, and his wife, Mrs. Behears, 57, were found dead to death in a parked coupe early last Thursday morning at a road near Denver, Colorado, where they had made their home the past several years.

Behears, according to Denver police, also and killed his wife 400, then, after making a check of the car, ended his own life with the same weapon.

Behears, according to Denver police, after killing his wife, Behears departed almost the entire night in the car, and on his own life, and that he finally chose death.

Behears had been shot once through the left temple. A second shot struck in the chest and right temple. His right hand clutched a .22-caliber revolver when he was found.

Behears was in a sitting position, his head turned back against the seat.

A woman's black coat had been placed over the bodies, and cartridges rained in the lap of the dead woman. She was wearing a nap, blue-tinted dress. Behears was in his shirt sleeves.

Behears' gun One empty cartridge and several loaded ones were found about 10 feet from the machine, indicating, according to officers, that Behears got out of the car after shooting his wife, released the gun although one bullet had been fired.

Behears had lived in Westminster and at various Denver addresses in the past several years.

Behears had been employed in a Denver home shop last Spring. Wednesday morning, Behears had left his home, and his wife returned to the car to take his own life.

Behears' relatives, occurred shortly after midnight and Behears is believed to have shot himself about 6:30 p. m.

STUDENTS PREFER VOCATION CLASSES

High School Enrollment Approaches Expected-Totals-Indicates Trends

Among approximately 1100 students attending the Twin Falls high school during the term opened next Tuesday, 806 had registered for the first time. Two-day enrollment period. Registrations of 200 more students is expected by the opening of the new school year next Tuesday.

Students transferring from other high schools will be enrolled today, along with others who do not register Thursday or Friday, H. D. Hechtner, high school principal said.

Total enrollment is expected to approach the 1934-35 record, though reliance of some students may be placed on account of farm work, the principal said.

Trend of students' preferences as shown by this year's registration is toward vocational subjects, though there is light enrollment in agricultural subjects, and toward vocation classes are full, the principal said.

Home economics classes are filling rapidly, and being taught by teachers who are general favorites. Students in most instances are selecting courses with regard for college entrance requirements, Mr. Hechtner said.

Registered at the high school building yesterday were 218 sophomores and 221 freshmen. On Thursday there were registered 180 seniors and 183 juniors.
