REBEL FORCES OF SPAIN—ENCOUNTER SLIGHT RESISTANCE

Insurgents, Capture Town of Guadalupe and Fort Guadalupe in Advance Toward San Sebastian

(By The Associated Press)

Spanish rebel troops, pressing toward the northern city of San Sebastian, and Fort Guadalupe and the town of Guadalupe Saturday night after silencing the last government defenders of the town.

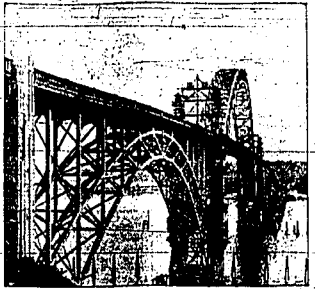
