Jenkins' Giant Racer Breaks Down During Record-Breaking Run

Utah's Famous Speed King Shatters Five World Marks in First Eight Hours Of Driving Over Salt Flats

(By The Associated Press) BONNEVILLE SALT FLATS, Utah, Sept. 7—Ab Jenkins' projected 48-hour assault against time ended abruptly tonight when his huge, ruddered automobile broke down after 1,842 record-breaking miles.

The giant racer had thundered around the 10-mile saline course since 6:04 a. m. Pacific time, when Jenkins' "Norman Meteor" was two miles out on the 15th lap when it went dead.

LABOR, POLITICAL LEADERS ADDRESS HOLIDAY AUDIENCES

Federation Split and Organized Workers' Part in Presidential Campaign Figure in Day's Flood of Oratory

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Sept. 7—The split in the American Federation of Labor and Laborers' part in the presidential campaign stood out among issues discussed today in a flood of Labor day oratory.

The holidays recalled their political speech-making generally. There were signs that the holiday—as many presidential campaign years of the past—might go down as the starting point of intensive drives toward the political home-coming.

For many thousands the day marked the end of the vacation season. Trains and buses from beaches and mountain resorts to urban centers were jammed. Highways were crowded. Amusement companies reported good business.

Sports events attracted huge crowds and there were innumerable family reunions.

Royal Leaders Speak

William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, told a rally at Knoxville, Tennessee, that "enemies of labor" would benefit from the present split between the A. F. of L. and the United Mine Workers.

London Urges Unity

180 Rebel Hostages Escape from Dungeon

(By The Associated Press) MADRID, France, Sept. 7 (AP)—Rebels from the Pucierro area, the escape of 180 Pucierro rebel hostages from the dungeons of Pucierro.

Madrid Celebrates Reported Victories In Toledo

(By The Associated Press) MADRID, Sept. 7 (AP)—The Madrid-Socialist government celebrated reported victories over Fascist rebels in Toledo province tonight, though rebel troops in four columns closed in on San Sebastian.

Government authorities in the southern zone said their victory at Talavera "eliminates the hitherto imminent danger of a new offensive against the zone." The government declared rebels at Zaragoza in the northeast were "in a desperate situation."

Rebels on the Bay of Biscay coast, however, were confident that San Sebastian would fall by the end of the week, and they advanced with unhurried caution.

Anarchists Urge Burning

Refugees fleeing to France told of bitter discussion among defenders of the zone. Anarchists, they said, wanted to burn San Sebastian to keep it from the hands of the rebels.

Anarchists handed round the word of the zone. They urged that the zone be burned and pillaged, stating while other groups composed mainly of women raised various farms for food.

Other refugees arriving in San Sebastian said they had food and water but were fast giving out in the government-held city of Bilbao, and they predicted its fall soon.

American Among Refugees

Americans were among refugees inside Fort Mido in the United States destroyer Kane, which was being used as a base for the zone.

FRANCE INCREASES BUDGET FOR ARMY

Government to Spend Extra \$912,000,000 in Next Four Years

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, Sept. 7 (AP)—Informed sources said tonight that the French government would spend an extra \$912,000,000 in the next four years in the form of what the French cabinet termed "war danger."

The cabinet earlier had announced that \$775,000,000 would be spent on all three branches of France's armed forces in 1937, which they called "the first allotment."

Problems of the cabinet were intensified by a one-hour demonstration of workers who quit to protest against a new plan for the shipment of munitions to Spain.

Over 25,000 military workers employed in 2,500 factories, the majority of the interior announced nearly 200,000 struck in the protest.

More than 4,000 clothing workers occupied factories in Amiens demanding increased salaries.

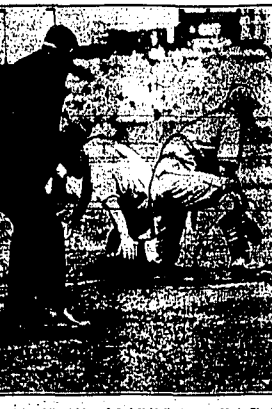
