

sun-powered engine. The machine is
butly of three curved alumnium mirores set side by side long-wise on a rotating axis so they may be turned to
follow the sun from cast to west, plus
elect of class these and some other

Jollow the sun from east to west, plusal to it of glass tubes and some other gadgets.

—The polished surfaces of the aluminum sheets reflect and concentrate the rays of the sun on a number of little glass tubes, heating a new chemical substance they contain. The temperature reaches three hundred and fifty degrees or more and the chemical then passes through tubes in an ordinary boiler filled with water. The high temperature turns the water into ateam, which, in turn, operates a small half-horsepower engine. The inventor hasised a smillar device on Mount Wilson in California, for cooking, He believes such machine will some day furnish energy for refrigeration and various other purposes. Unfortunately for this particular demonstration, the Washington sun-rahine-prove too strong for the device. Certain solder joints were metted and the important chemical trickled out, leaving the engine powerless.

That should not be too clisionarging. It is probably only a matter of time, and surface prefetting of inventions, until we succeed in using the energy of the search of the conditional conditions, and so on.

electric service companies then operating in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon were in financial distress. Some companies competed with one another to such an extent that they were

financially unable to maintain satisfactory service. In many places, rates had been as high as twenty cents per kilowatt hour. Prior to this time Twin Falls used power from a steam threshing engine. Boise had used a "water wheel"; Caldwell and many other towns had used small coalburning steam plants. Each little plant did its best; none was equal to the job. The interests of the consumer were often forgotten.

Then, in 1916, the Idaho Power Company was formed by a group of farsighted men, including the stock and bondholders of the predecessor companies. They had the vision to realize that the territory must have good, dependable electric service in order to grow. At once progress was made, the properties were brought together

Into a single working unit, lines were inter-connected, wasteful duplication of equipment was gradually eliminated.




