Poll Gives Lead To Republicans in North and West

London leads Roosevelt by slightly more than 50 to 40 as the results of a nationwide poll of 200,000 voters in this week's tabulation of "The Literary Digest" national-wide Presidential poll.

London is shown receiving 272,705 votes against 185,827 for Roosevelt in the 1932 poll of a total of 458,532 voters reported.

Great changes are called for in eight states and more returns are announced from the thirteen states included in the 1932-1936 report.

Scattering early returns from Colorado indicate approximately a 2 to 1 lead for Roosevelt in that state from the neighboring state of Kansas.

Kansas gives its favorite son better than a 3 to 1 lead over Roosevelt in the initial tally of the Sunday Digest.

North Dakota shows the Republican candidate leading with a scant majority of 51 to 49 over Roosevelt. Lemke, whose home state it is, receives more than 7 per cent of the first small batch of ballots.

Additional ballots from Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, Minnesota, New York, and Ohio, also show only slight changes from the previous week's balloting.

An analysis of the Lemke supporters voted in 1932 shows that of Lemke's total balloting of less than 200,000 first 3700 of his votes were for Hoover today and 400,000 for Roosevelt and 325 for Thomas.
