





What protection have you for your sugar beets in the future? Look at the action of Secretary of Agriculture Wallace when he tried to curtail acreage.

Only through the Agricultural Adjustment Act being declared unconstitutional has the present Democratic administration been forced to halt the program to reduce your crops.
