# Home Made Eats Are Popular At College

**Filled Scotch Slices**  
 1/2 cup fat  
 2/3 cup brown sugar  
 1 egg  
 2 tablespoons cream  
 1/2-teaspoon nutmeg  
 1/2-teaspoon cinnamon  
 1/2-teaspoon salt  
 1-teaspoon vanilla  
 1 cup rolled oats  
 1 2/3 cups flour  
 2 teaspoons baking powder

**Cream Fat and Sugar**. Add egg and cream. Beat 2 minutes. Add rest of ingredients—mixing—lightly—roll dough. Roll out 1/8 of 1/4 until 1/4 inch thick. Cover with filling and fold dough over and on top. This is usually easier than placing the rest of dough rolled out and on top. Either method can be used. Cut bars 2-3/4 by 2 inches and place 1/4 inch apart on greased baking sheet and bake 12 minutes in moderate oven. Sprinkle with confectioner's sugar. Proceed with the remaining dough in same manner.

**RECIPES FOR APPLES**  
 —AMERICA'S FRUIT

**Apple Pie**  
 Sift one cup of flour and one-fourth teaspoon of salt into a bowl. Rub into it four tablespoons of shortening, until the whole is reduced to a fine powder. Add cold water slowly to make a stiff dough. Roll, spread with a tablespoon of shortening, fold and roll again. Cover tin loosely with this paste, brush over with white of egg, fill with thin slices of good cooking apples. Sprinkle with one cup of sugar mixed with a tablespoon of flour. Sprinkle over a few small lumps of butter. Moisten edges with unbeat white of egg. Cover with paste. Bake in moderate oven until apples are done — about thirty minutes.

**Dutch Apple Pie**  
 Place thickly quartered Jonathan apples in deep pie tin lined with any good rich crust. Sprinkle freely with sugar and cinnamon and dot with bits of butter on top. Fill one-half full with sweet milk or cream. If you feel extravagant and like a moderate oven until tender.

**Pineapple Apple Pie**  
 Take a pint of grated apples, add a half cup of sugar, a pinch of salt and a half tablespoon of flour. Line a pie pan with pastry, add the grated apples, dot with butter and bake until the apples are tender. To a half cup grated pineapple, add one-quarter cup of sugar and a little lemon juice. Roll up, spread hot over the pie. Cover with apricot glaze.

**Apple Dumplings**  
 Make stiff, rich biscuit dough. Cut apples in quarters and wrap dough around, pinching ends together. Put one pint of water into a baking dish, add one cup of sugar and small piece of butter. Roll out top of dough, put in dumplings and bake in hot oven until apples are done. Serve hot with raisin sauce. Blend one cup of brown sugar with two tablespoons flour and butter size of egg. Add two cups boiling water and cook over brisk fire and stir with a miller or mangle.

**Brown Betty**  
 Into a baking pan, put alternate layers of sliced apples and bread crumbs until the pan is filled. Pour over all a sauce made of two cups of sugar, one cup of milk and one cup of butter. Sprinkle top with nutmeg. Bake in moderate oven about two hours. Serve with hard sauce or whipped cream.

**Apple Sauce Cakes**  
 One cup butter, sugar, one-half

cup shortening, one and a half cups of apple sauce sweetened, two heaping cups flour, two level teaspoons soda, one teaspoon each cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg, one cup raisins, one cup chopped nuts (walnuts or others). Cream, sugar and

**Shortening**. Add spices. Then add flour and soda sifted together, with the nuts and raisins thrown in. Mix all thoroughly together. Add apple sauce last. Be careful to have a stiff batter. Bake in a loaf tin slow oven. This cake may be warmed and used as a pudding with hard sauce.

**Apple Crackle Pudding**  
 Siew five or six apples with just enough sugar to sweeten, a few raisins and a little cinnamon. When tender, cool. Now beat the yolks of six eggs and one cup of sugar until like a thick batter. Add grated peel of lemon and four crackers rolled very fine. Last add the egg whites beaten stiff. Butter a pudding dish, pour in the apples, then the custard and bake. Serve cold with whipped cream.

**Apple Day Salad**  
 Cut off tops of six apples. Scoop out inside and mix with one cup celery, one-half cup shelled pecans and one cup mayonnaise. Fill apple shells with this, and serve with a teaspoon of mayonnaise on each apple.

**Crimesen Jamon Apple Pie**  
 Peel and core six Jonathan apples. Place in pan with cup of sugar, small package of red cinnamon and drop candied, and enough water to

cover. Cook on top of stove until apples are tender, turn- ing carefully at intervals so color- ing will be even. Serve cold, with fruit, or may be dressed with ranch, ketchup and cheese.

**Apple Muffins**  
 One pint of flour, one-half tea- spoon salt, two teaspoons baking powder, one-quarter cup of butter, half a cup of sugar, one egg, one cup of milk, one cup thinly sliced apples. Bake in muffin pans in quick oven.

### COMMUNIST TICKET ON STATE BALLOTS

Survey Indicates Sweeping Bid for Support of Browder, Ford

WASHINGTON, Oct. 16 (AP)—A survey shows today that the Communist presidential ticket will be represented on the ballots in at least 31 states on election day, Nov. 8.

Arrangements for filing were still under way in some states; and are expected to be completed in a number of states by the end of the week.

The seventh week's tabulation shows Landon with 1,004,066 popular votes to Roosevelt's 728,085 and Lemke's 518,181.

A division of the electoral college indicates Landon would receive 210 electoral votes to Roosevelt's 181.

Initial returns are reported in this column. Landon leads in 17 states, Roosevelt in 14, and Lemke in 1.

Delaware gives the Republican candidate an edge of less than 5 to 4 while West Virginia is shown indicating a Republican majority of three to 2.

South Carolina's first batch of returns gives Roosevelt a lead of 10 to 1.
