Nation's Voters Endorse New Deal Borah Leads Ross; Stephan Trails Clark At Idaho Polls

Democrats Make Clean Sweep Of All State Offices

Republican 'Lone Wolf' Running Side By Side With Roosevelt On Mounting New Deal Vote

BOISE, Nov. 4 (Wednesday morning)—Returns from a third of Idaho's 793 precincts gave the Democratic party today a commanding lead in all but the United States senatorial contest.

Senator William E. Borah, Republican "lone wolf," was riding solo by side with President Franklin D. Roosevelt on a mounting Democratic tide.

He was the lone candidate of his party on the state ticket to emerge apparently victorious from one of the hottest campaigns in the state's 46-year history.

Governor C. Ben Ross, lately serving one-time cowboy, who served his native state as chief executive, three consecutive two-year terms before resigning in 1936, when he retired for the night.

Borah remained up until a late hour, but declined to comment on the result of his own contest, after admitting he did not expect to win.

Approximately 200,000 voters were registered in the state. It is estimated that close to 200,000 turned out.

From the start, the Democratic lead looked final.

The sales tax, enacted in 1933 to produce funds for relief, apparently was going down to a 2-50-50 defeat.

The 1938 election is being held on the same day as the only other in the race.

New Deal Congressional Power Remains Virtually Unchanged

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4 (Wednesday)—Democratic majorities in both houses of Congress apparently are holding their own in the new Congress, despite the fact that the Democrats have elected none except Senator White in Idaho's September election to add to the 11 they carried over from the old senate.

Many Clinics in Doubt Of the 34 senate contests still unsettled, the Democrats were leading in 12, the Republicans in 8, a party-laborer in 1, and Senator Ross of Nebraska, running as an independent, in the other.

Indications early this morning, with the count still incomplete in six of Twin Falls precincts and Kimberly, were that Mrs. Strady had won the county superintendent's office by a substantial margin over her Democratic opponent, Mrs. Grace Gill of Kimberly.

Roosevelt Wins Reelection With Landslide Vote

President Piles Up Overwhelming Lead In 45 Of 48 States With Possibility Of Capturing 46th

Democrats Favored For Congress

(By The Associated Press) A smashing triumph for President Roosevelt and the new deal emerged today from the ballot boxes of the nation.

Incomplete but pointedly indicative returns placed 45 states in the Roosevelt column, presaged an electoral vote of unexampled proportions, and held promise of an increased Democratic membership in congress.

Leading in but three states; and they with a total of but 12 electoral votes, Governor Landon yielded to the inevitable in the small hours of this morning and dispatched his message to the victorious president at Hyde Park:

The nation has spoken. Every American will accept the verdict and work for the common cause of the good of the country. That is the spirit of democracy. You have my sincere congratulations.

"For Common Good" There was little expectation among those who have closely followed the development of the last two months, that the Republican minority would land any cooperation to the president in furthering his program.

To Governor Landon, the president early in the day dispatched a letter of congratulation. "I am glad that all of us Americans will now pull together for the common good."

At Lowell, Md. As the governor's message circulated over the wires eastward, his electoral fortunes were at the lowest ebb touched by the candidates of a major party in this country.

It is apparent that Roosevelt has won a victory almost equal in scope to that of 1932.

He added: "I had no doubt as to Roosevelt's reelection, but I didn't expect the majority to be so large."

"The western states all will be in line for Roosevelt when the first returns are in."

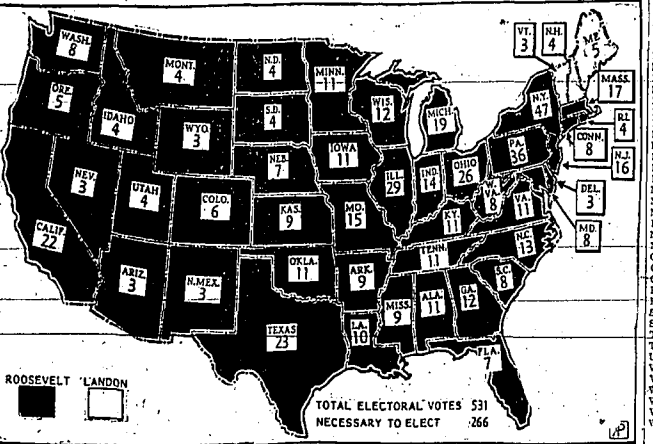

SHIPS STRIKE HEADS TOWARD FRESH CRISIS

Curran Foresees 'Plenty of Violence' as Owners Move to Put 'Safety Crews' on Strike-Bound Vessels

(By The Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3.—Violence, foreseen of more trouble and additional sympathy walkouts marked, the maritime strike here, lunched opposing sides in a showdown on the question of furnishing "safety crews" for affected west coast ships.

Five maritime unions were held at a luncheon harbor on suspicion of assaulting, robbing and kidnapping crew workers who were sent ashore voluntarily for safety. The unions said their assailants were anti-union "flying squadrons" stevedores.

Police indicated that harbor as well as the Houston, Texas, waterfront. In the latter city strikers claimed they were to be outlawed. Strikers claimed six ships were tied up there. Police ordered five strike leaders to leave the city.

In New Orleans a large group of men attacked—and overturned—a truck, forcing the driver to flee. Police said the attack was the result of striking longshoremen. Three men were under arrest as the result of a beating allegedly given to a man who had no part in the attack.

Another "shipdown" strike prevented one ship from leaving New York harbor but one vessel was allowed to depart. An sympathy strike of an insurance saleswoman, David Granger, third vice president of the International Seamen's union, said his unit would put crew on all affected ships and arm them.

KING'S PEACE PLEA OPENS PARLIAMENT

Edward-VIII addresses Britain's Lawmakers; Mrs. Simpson Absent

LONDON, Nov. 3 (AP)—King Edward pledged his government to "peaceful settlement of international disputes" in ceremonial address opening British parliament today.

The government will continue to do all in their power to further the appointment of Europe, he told a brilliant assemblage of lords, officials and spectators in the house of lords.

In his first parliamentary appearance since his accession to the throne, the king dispensed previous reports in conversation. May might be postponed and announced his intention of going to India to be crowned emperor.

Mrs. Simpson Absent Mrs. Wallis Simpson, the monarch's American friend, was not among the throng of ceremonially dressed spectators who crowded the galleries to especially.

First affirming his declaration of protest faith, the king began the reading of his speech standing before the throne in a circle of lords.

Then he wore the heavy state robes of gold-veiled crimson velvet.

Mr. Chamberlain will remain in power continue to be friendly," he said, using the personal form of address which was formerly reserved for the king's closest intimates.

"The policy of the government continues to be based on membership in the league of nations."

Then he launched into a detailed description of governmental plans which included:

Hops for extension to all naval powers of the existing treaty limiting the armaments of Germany, Great Britain, France and the United States last March.

Support of the international agreement for non-intervention in the Spanish civil war with continuation of every opportunity to mitigate human suffering and loss of life in that unhappy country.

"Ratification of the treaty signed by an Egyptian government to extend loyal cooperation between two governments and peoples whose destinies are inseparably bound together."

Imperial Conference Calling an imperial conference in London next May to promote "a closer understanding between the members of our central government."

Strengthening of British defense forces as "essential to the defense of the empire and to the ability of the country to discharge its international obligations."

My ministers will, nevertheless, seize no opportunity of promoting general international agreements and the limitation of expenditure on armaments which, naturally would follow such an improvement in relations," King Edward declared.

A heavy minister robbed the parliamentary ceremony of part of its brilliance and induced the king to ride from Buckingham palace to the house of lords in a closed motor car, instead of a horse-drawn carriage.

Queen Mary, confined to Marlborough house with a cold, watched her son drive by. The king waved at her.

After the king's speech, the speaker of the house of commons commented the royal address to the lower chamber.

U. S. Makes New Bid To Australia

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (AP)—New requests were made by the United States to Australia today in an effort to end a trade impasse which has confronted the two nations more than five months.

Australia last May invoked a series of prohibitions on imports of American goods, interest chiefly and other acts under which it was estimated this country would suffer a loss of approximately \$4,000,000 annually.

The United States retaliated by raising the tariff on the list of Australian goods which it extends most favored tariff treatment.

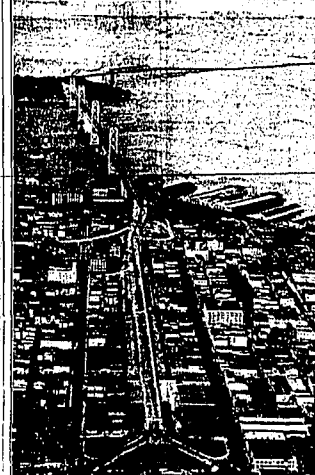

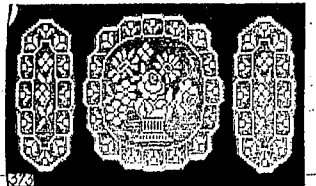

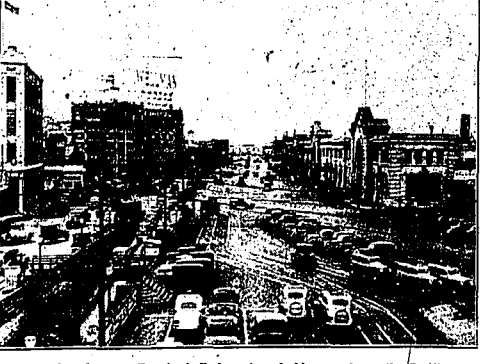
