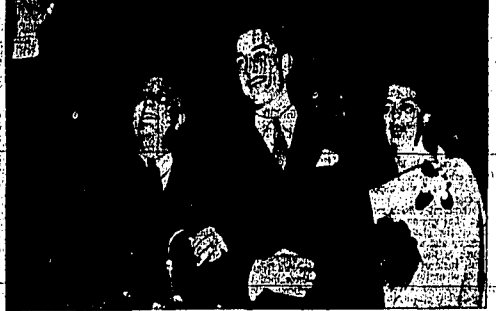
Homeless Children Brought To Madrid

(Continued From Page One) of both sides during the week. Thousands of government militiamen poured back from Getafe and Sanjurjo from Madrid to confine their lines within the city limits.

During the day long bombardment of the Madrid area from land and air, a 100-pound bomb scored a direct hit on the Carabanchel military hospital. Debris was scattered in the street, but apparently the bomb did not explode.

The Getafe airport, another important base of the rebels, was again bombed by a gasoline dump.

An unconfirmed report in Lisbon today said 2,000 persons were killed in the bombardment of the Madrid area.

Insurgents Advance WITH THE REBEL TROOPS NEAR PARLA, 11 MILES SOUTH OF MADRID, Nov. 5 (AP)—Their paths cleared by artillery and aviation, three lines of insurgents advanced in triangular formation on Madrid tonight.

The right wing occupied Getafe, eight miles from the capital, and kept heavy bombardment of government positions blocking their drive.

In the center, other Fascist troops took control of Leganes, almost straight west of Getafe. The third column moved into positions overlooking Cuatro Vientos airport, on a small hill about seven miles southwest of Madrid. Their immediate objective was the government aviation field, the Socialist radio station at Campanero and suburban street car terminals.

The capture of Getafe came after a surprise government counter-attack on Fascist lines near Terlan Do Velasco.

Under Cover of Night Under cover of night 1,200 government militiamen crept close to the insurgent positions. As dawn broke they attacked with artillery and aviation. Fascist sentries spread the alarm quickly.

March troops of General Jose Varela poured out of barracks to join in a battle overhead. After much fighting, the rebels were repulsed and scattered back along the way they had come.

At Odds With New Deal In one way or another, a small group of Democratic senators has frequently found itself at odds with the new deal. Its members have not voted as a group against new deal measures, but individually on one issue or another have opposed the White House proposals.

Senator Glass of Virginia has denounced the Roosevelt monetary and banking program in no uncertain terms. His colleague Senator Byrd has been vigorously opposed to new deal expenditures and has insisted upon an economy program.

Senator Copeland of New York declined to attend the Democratic national convention, although a delegate. 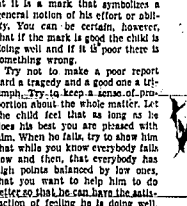

MONGOLS BACKING CHINESE REGIME

Leaders Resist Japanese Efforts to Create Buffer State

KUOIHUA, Inner Mongolia, Nov. 25 (AP) — Mongols in Bulgan province are rallying behind the Chinese government, refusing to deal with Japanese agents who press the border from Chahar province, informed observers believe.

"Mongolia for the Mongolians" has long been the dream of Mongol leaders, whose ancestors once dominated the largest empire the world has ever seen.

Actual independence for the Mongols seems out of the question. Outer Mongolia on the north is already under advisement of Soviet Russia.

Manchukuo to the east and the Hoptai-Chahar area of North China bring Japanese influences to Inner Mongolia's front door.

Today this region finds itself sandwiched between the mounting animosities of Japan and Soviet Russia, with Chinese influences hanging precariously in the balance.

Mongol leaders declare continuous efforts are being made by Japanese military agents to convert Inner Mongolia into a buffer state between North China and Soviet Outer Mongolia.

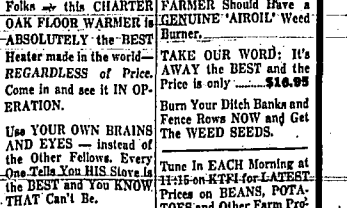

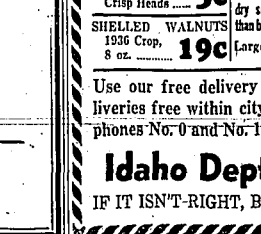

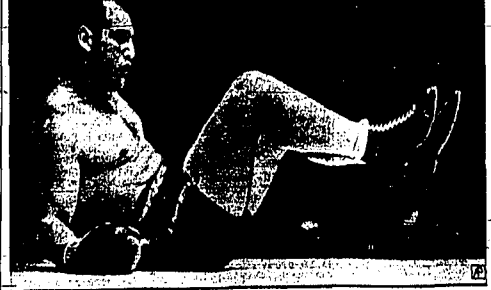
