OFFICIAL ASKS FOR PROBE OF STATE DEPARTMENT Public Accounts Director Karl Evans Requests Grand Jury Investigation of Alleged Irregularities

BOISE, Nov. 6.—In a letter to Willis Moffatt, Ada county prosecuting attorney, Karl Evans, director of the state department of public accounts, requested tonight that the Ada county grand jury be called to make "a thorough investigation of alleged irregularities in the conduct of state government affairs."

Moffatt said he would confer with the prosecuting attorney, Carroll Zapp, attorney now for the state insurance fund, before taking any action.

Evans, an appointee of Governor Ross, concluded his letter to Moffatt with the statement: "In my opinion these conditions can be corrected only through a thorough and complete grand jury investigation."

The prosecuting attorney is legally empowered to recommend to the district court a grand jury investigation be instituted.

Evans' grand jury charges: 1. Illegal purchase of approximately \$10,000 of equipment. 2. Presentation by an employee of a claim for services not actually rendered. 3. Irregular purchase of bonds by a state official. 4. Presentation by an employee of a claim for services not actually rendered. 5. Irregular purchase of bonds by a state official.

Twin Falls County Gives Roosevelt 1125 More for Re-election

President Roosevelt, as a candidate for re-election last Tuesday, received 1125 more votes in Twin Falls county than he was given by the county in 1932. It was disclosed yesterday upon completion of the county commissioners' official canvass of election returns. The county's vote for the Democratic nominee, Alvin K. Smith, was the nominee.

The Republican nominee for governor, Frank L. Stephens of Twin Falls, who 693 votes, ran ahead of the Republican presidential nominee by 1075 votes. The Democratic candidate for governor, Bernard W. Clark of Boise, polled 678 votes, which was 812 less than Roosevelt received in this county.

Thomas Thomas, socialist candidate for president, received in this county this year only 719 votes, as compared with 163 four years ago, and 78 in 1928. Union party presidential electors polled 271 votes, somewhat ahead of the Liberty party's electors in 1932 who received 213 votes.

Amendments approved. The official count of last Tuesday's election returns shows that the county had turned down the state sales tax law, 4320 to 3223, but had approved both proposed amendments to the state constitution. The vote was 8719 to 2417 for the amendment providing for appeal to the supreme court of industrial accident claims, and 4026 to 3128 for the amendment to permit changes of state lands.

The election of one Republican candidate for county office, Mrs. Doris Shirley, nominee for county superintendent of public instruction, was established by the official canvass which gave her 3350 majority, a margin of 124 over the total polled.

Hoover said agents seized the pair's house in Richmond. They were jailed there pending removal to Washington.

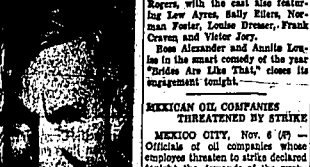

Idaho Farm Prices Over Pre-War Level

BOISE, Nov. 6 (AP) - Idaho's farmers are doing well. The federal index of prices paid to them on October 14 was 114 per cent of the pre-war level, a decline of one per cent from a month ago. Prices of grain, feed crops and other crops advanced; fruits and vegetables declined from 127 per cent last month to 126 per cent on October 15 bringing the all crop index down from 112 per cent on September 15 to 109 per cent.

The all-livestock and livestock products index now stands at 120 per cent of the pre-war level. An increase in prices of poultry products was about offset by the decline in the price of most animals.

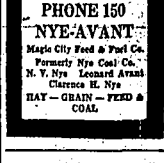

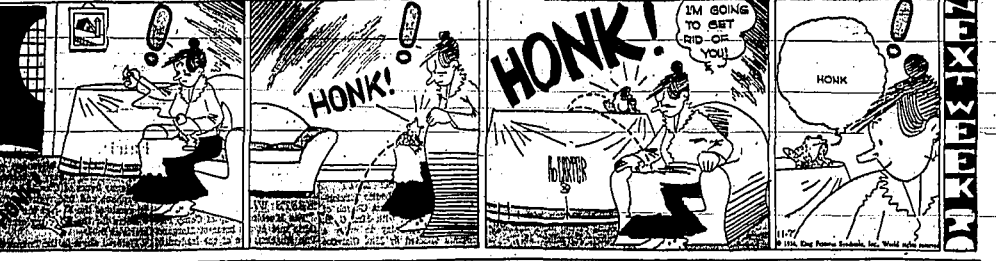

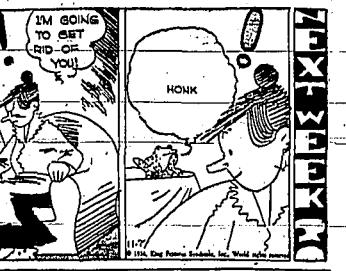
