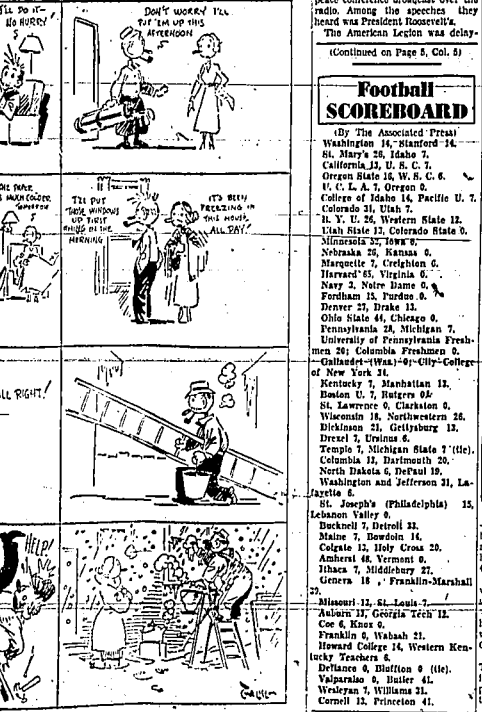

FINANCIAL COMMITTEE SEEKS AGREEMENT

Head of Industrial Organization Group Ready to Talk Peace

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26 (AP)—The industrial organization group headed by John J. Lewis, committee for the national organization of labor, is ready to talk peace with the American Federation of Labor.

The committee notified William Green, national president of the A. F. of L., that he had authorized Lewis to confer with him about terms for an agreement which would bring the suspended unions back into the A. F. of L.

Lewis said, however, the committee would demand reinstatement of the suspended unions before any agreement would be made.

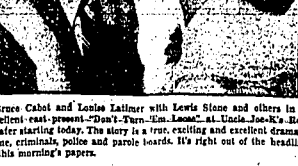

BATTLE EXPECTED ON LIQUOR RULE

Advertising and Enforcement Lively Issues in Legislature

BOISE, Nov. 7.—Prepared changes in Idaho's liquor laws engaged a lot of minds Friday as the legislature began to assess the results of the vote's decision. One of the biggest battles expected over the future handling of beer licenses in the state.

The only thing about the present law which has been interpreted as the size of the present license fee, and probably predicted a strong move on behalf of the brewers and retailers to get the legislature to reduce the license fees to a minimum and leave the law as it stands. Advocates of stricter liquor enforcement on the other hand, want to see the licensing of beer placed in the hands of the liquor commission. It is desired in its present place in the hands of the department of public safety.

The argument thus advanced is that if a beer retailer violates the state law he will be fined in his place, the commission can at once cancel his license. In this way it is argued that beer retailers will be kept a long time from jeopardizing his beer license, which is valuable, merely to sell a few drinks.

Advertising considered. Still others advocate a strict limit in the law which would prohibit the advertising of liquor in any Idaho publication. They contend that the legislature intended to prohibit advertising of liquor in the law as follows: "Except as permitted by federal statute there shall be no public advertising of alcoholic liquors in any form of manner within the state of Idaho."

Opponents of liquor advertising so far have not contended there has been any violation of the state law, but the legislature and many of them are members of the legislature which passed the act—that they intended to do so by the regulations issued by the commission and then issued in strict accordance with such regulations.

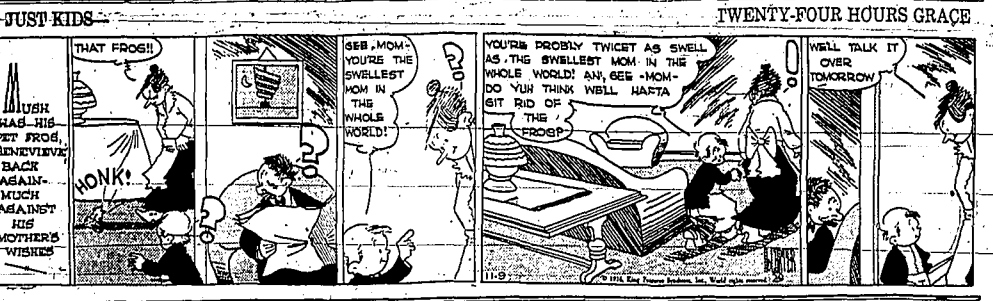

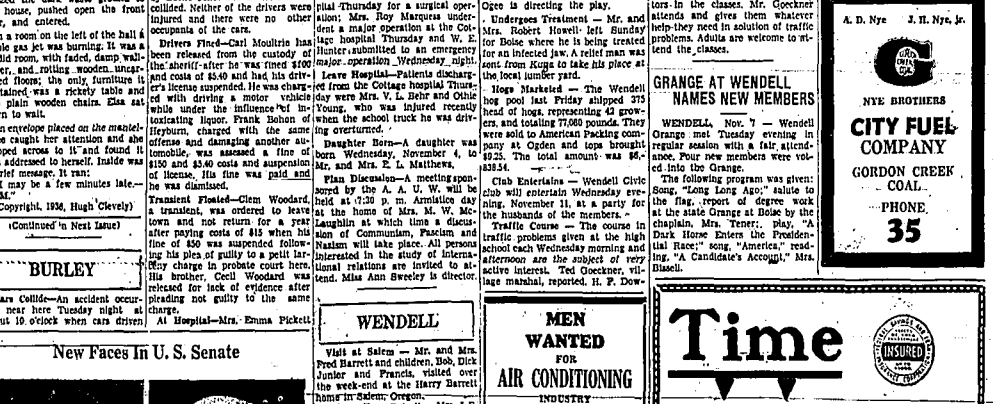
