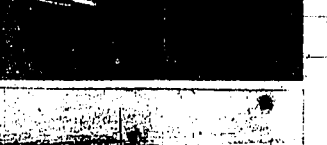

NAMPA, Idaho, Nov. 18 (AP)—The railway men asserted today that the proposed increased freight rates would seriously hamper the Idaho prune industry was presented today at a conference of executives of 19 middle western nursery and shipper groups from Idaho, Oregon, Idaho, Colorado and Washington.

Testimony will be taken under advisement by the carriers representative following a banquet meeting tonight.

J. H. McElroy of Boise, president of the Idaho Prune Growers' association, told the conference that officials of the past two years have encouraged prune growers to build up their orchards.

Shippers are attempting to secure from the railway executives an agreement to extend the time for expiration of emergency rates.

Emergency Rates

Throughout the day witnesses offered testimony designed to show that emergency freight rates on fruit and vegetables should be made permanent in the interest of the industry in Idaho.

R. H. Young of Parma, a grower representing the Idaho Vegetable Producers, Canyon county Pomona and the Idaho state Grange, presented figures showing, he said, the cost of producing onions would not stand an increase in freight rates.

Fredson Capell and A. Bay, Nampa, witnesses testified that rates from Michigan and Minnesota have been decreased to southeastern markets and the lowered rate in those states had taken away the Mississippi market, from Idaho and Colorado. They pointed out that trucks were being largely employed in the southern states to market onions.

G. A. Root of Salt Lake City, Bert Barker of Wenatchee, Washington, and Austin Anson of Memphis, representing the shippers, and L. T. Wilcox of Omaha, assistant traffic manager of the Union Pacific, appeared for the railroads at the hearings.

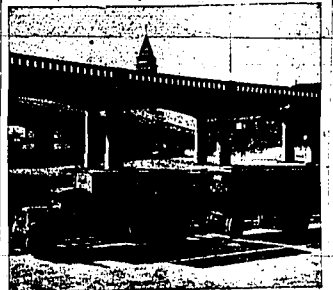
