# SENATOR BRANDS COLONY 'FAILURE'

## Thomas, Democrat, Reports Experiment in Alaska Unsuccessful

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (AP)—The government's effort to plant a colony in Matanuska valley, Alaska, was called a "failure" today by Senator Thomas (D-Calif.) who said he was convinced the ambitious project would "collapse" as soon as federal aid is withdrawn.

"The experiment is worth every penny it cost," he added, "because it has proved once and for all that it is not suitable for large-scale colonization."

Thomas spent a month in the Matanuska valley last July and winter. He said that because the climate is 24 hours a day during the brief summer season, vegetables grow in lush abundance, but their rapid growth makes them soft and virtually worthless for marketing.

He said the valley's riches "lasted like an echo," and that potatoes have to be dried out in a slow oven before they can be stored even a short time.

They produce cannot be sold readily even in the local market, Thomas said, because most Alaskans can buy better produce from the United States at about the same cost.

# BORAN URGES SUPPORT FOR RECLAMATION

Republican presidential nomination candidate.

"I did not quite obtain the expected power in the recent campaign but I did fail. Page would remain where he is."

Senator Boran said his own statement on the great project of "irrigation water" and his district "Don't forget the man on the land who needs more water. We will go along with you, but you must go along with us."

"I shall always be ready to support any reasonable proposal to water on land—whether new or old," he said.

### Senate Remarks

Governor Clarence D. Martin of Washington, welcome to the session, outlined the keynote of the session.

The land frontier, the west, is to be built for the millions of people in the east through a continuation of the constructive and progressive reclamation policy," he said. turns."

O'Mahoney's statement reflected the hopes, if not the beliefs, of many new deal leaders, that the country decision was evidence of a new division on the high front.

### TRANSACTION TAX URGED FOR IDAHO

#### Townsend Leader Proposes New Levy to Raise \$30,000,000

BOISE, Nov. 23 (AP)—Idaho political talk turned to taxes tonight.

Townsend proposed enactment of a state transaction tax law to raise \$30,000,000 annually for old-age pensions and other real and personal property levies.

The proposal came through E. C. Davis, state Townsend manager, as the 100-0 per cent retail sales tax act was offered a lingering defeat by failure of one county to get the official report of the November 3 referendum vote in its territory.

Davis estimated the proposed tax could be applied yearly to \$1,500,000,000 business in the form of sales, barrier and exchange of real and personal property; gifts and intangibles such as stocks.

He estimated 20,000 persons, who are past 60 years of age, would benefit to the extent of \$50 to \$75 monthly.

Of the \$30,000,000, \$10,000,000, he said, would be devoted to reduction of the annual \$150,000,000 ad valorem tax bill imposed by the state and its taxing units.

At present 7,000 Idaho aged are receiving approximately 121 monthly each from receipt of the sales tax.

#### More Liberal Distribution

The purposes of the Townsend-proposed measure are "more liberal distribution and increase of purchasing power, improvement and stabilization of gainful employment, stimulation of agricultural and industrial production and alleviation of the hazards and insecurity of old age," Davis explained.

The commission's act of finance would enforce collection provisions of the act and an administrator would supervise distribution of proceeds.

"This is a wide departure from previous tax plans; ours will tax persons instead of property, and it is feasible," Davis commented.

The sales tax law was rejected by voters in 24 counties and approved by 20 counties.

The tax apparently was voted out in the statewide referendum November 3, and was to have continued until today, the date the state canvassing board met to certify voters. However the canvassing board adjourned without acting, pending receipt of official counts from four missing counties.

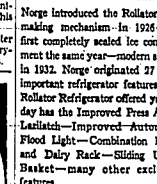

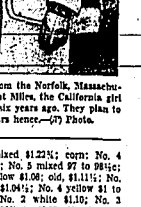
