DRIVE OPENED TO ADVERTISE IDAHO CHARM

State-wide Conference in Twin Falls Maps Program for Use of Public Funds to Put State in Linnelight

Legislation to provide for advertising of Idaho's recreational advantages, and to attract more tourists to the state each year, was advocated Monday afternoon by a group of nearly 50 representatives of various communities who met at the Park Hotel in Twin Falls.

Members of the group declared Idaho is losing thousands of dollars annually by not properly advertising its many recreational advantages as other western states are doing, and the group was unanimous in its opinion legislation to make funds available for this purpose would be necessary.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Dec. 7 (AP)—Six of the most prominent prisoners in Ohio State Penitentiary tonight, by setting fire to their cell block, "idle I over" for incorrigibles. Brandishing their "guns" made from steel bars with string handles, they set out with a pair of stolen wire clippers for a window screen high up in the dormitory wall. The guards were locked helpless in a cell.

Conference Receives Neutrality Proposal

Pact To Bind 21 Republics Against Aggression Offered At Buenos Aires

(By The Associated Press) BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 7.—A neutrality pact to bind all 21 American republics together against foreign aggression was proposed to the Inter-American Peace Conference tonight by Peru.

It was submitted shortly after the Chilean delegation presented an American arms limitation project which neutral observers believed had little chance of approval because of the armament race.

The Peruvian neutrality project provides that in case of war between a country in the western hemisphere and one outside it, signatories of the agreement could aid in armaments and supplying food to the American power but would suspend all traffic with the foreign nation.

The United States delegation yesterday submitted a neutrality proposal but it dealt largely with inter-American disputes, although providing for consultation among American nations whenever emergency arose which affect common interests.

Nicaragua Opposes Plan... The Nicaraguan proposal to confine armaments to the necessities of public order was met with opposition by Nicaragua, who declared it was dangerous "with Europe armed to the teeth"—indeed, armed to the very eyes.

The United States and Argentina were understood also to oppose the plan on the ground that armament limitation could be effective only on a world-wide scale.

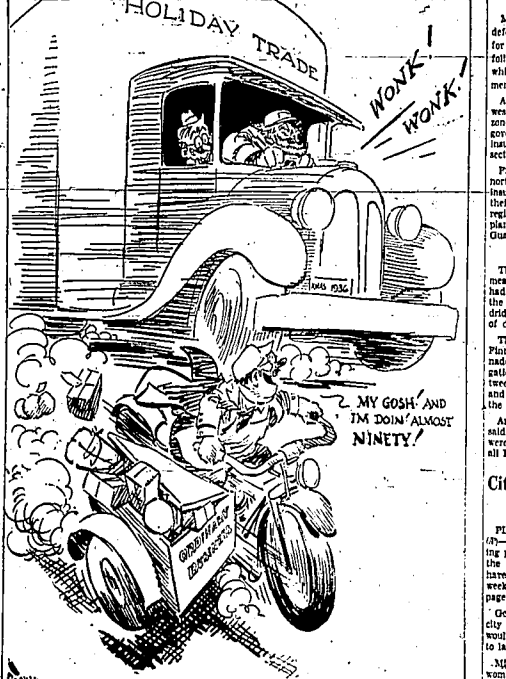

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AUTOMOBILE CRASH DAMAGES SETTLED

Duluth Man and Daughter Reach Agreement With Road Builders

Suits which Roy C. Grant and his daughter, Miss Dorothy Grant, both of Duluth, Minnesota, started in district court here for approximately \$50,000 damages growing out of an automobile accident near Alstairpark last September 11, were settled out of court yesterday when the first of the two suits was to have been brought to trial.

The amount of the settlement was not entered in the court records, but was reported to have been between \$10,000 and \$12,000.

Defendants were William Hoops and the Hoops Construction Company of Twin Falls and J. C. Compton, Boise road contractor.

Severely Injured Grant and his daughter were severely injured when the car in which they were traveling from Duluth to Berkeley, California, crashed against a truck that was allegedly operated by an employee of the highway builders.

Miss Grant received severe lacerations and fractures about the face and head, Grant received sprains, bruises and lacerations.

Miss Grant's claim for damages included \$500 for medical attention, \$562.25 for hospital and nursing, \$475 for dental treatment and \$25,000 for personal injuries.

Grant sued for \$250 medical attention, \$215.50 hospital bill, \$120 hotel bill and \$110 dental services, besides \$284 for his car and \$10,000 personal injury damages.

50-MILE LIMIT ON SPEED URGED

Idaho Peace Officers Draft Recommendations to Legislature

BOISE, Dec. 7. (AP)—The Idaho Peace Officers association legislative committee began drafting today a statutory amendment limiting the speed of all motor vehicles to 50 miles an hour on state highways.

The law now allows any speed consistent with safety.

The committee is composed of Sheriff Edna Roper, J. of Emmett, Frank Piersall of Caldwell and Ira Corey of Blackfoot.

The committee approved today a state police bill, providing for radio equipment, a bureau of identification, civil service regulation of officers and creation of a separate department headed by a superintendent with a salary of \$4,000 annually.

Four-Year Term The committee also started to draft a resolution calling for a constitutional amendment to limit the term of office for sheriffs from two to four years.

"The peace officers of Idaho and the state police are interested in law enforcement and better policing are going down the line for the three months in the coming legislature," said Emmitt Piersall, state commissioner of law enforcement and president of the peace officers' association.

Corporation Seeks Reorganization Under Bankruptcy Laws

SEATTLE, Dec. 7. (AP)—The Twin Falls-Jerome Inter-County Bridge company, of Seattle, owner of toll bridge between Twin Falls, Jerome, Idaho, filed a petition in federal court today for financial reorganization under terms of U. S. bankruptcy laws.

Frank B. Shurtz, Seattle attorney and company president, said in the petition the firm was not able to meet its debts. He said the bridge, operating over the Snake river, franchise since December, 1925, could not pay bonds and debentures due December 15.

Assets of the company included the bridge and the land upon which it rests. Liabilities were listed at \$350,500, principally in first mortgage bonds.

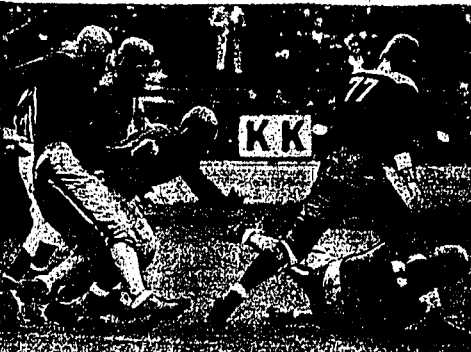
