DECISION UPHELD EMBARGO ON ARMS

Court Sustains Broad Delegation of Power in Foreign Affairs

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 (AP) - Neutrality legislation empowering the president to forbid the sale of raw materials as well as munitions to warring nations was upheld in a unanimous decision today by the Supreme Court.

UPHOLDING THE CONSTITUTIONALITY of broad delegation of power to the president in foreign affairs, the court ruled, 7 to 1, that in dealing with problems of neutrality, the chief executive may be accorded a degree of discretion and freedom from statutory restriction which would not be admissible were domestic affairs alone involved.

OFFICIALS FLEED State department officials, already on their way out of the city, were not neutrally legislated to be considered at the coming session of congress, made no secret of their pleasure at the court's decision.
