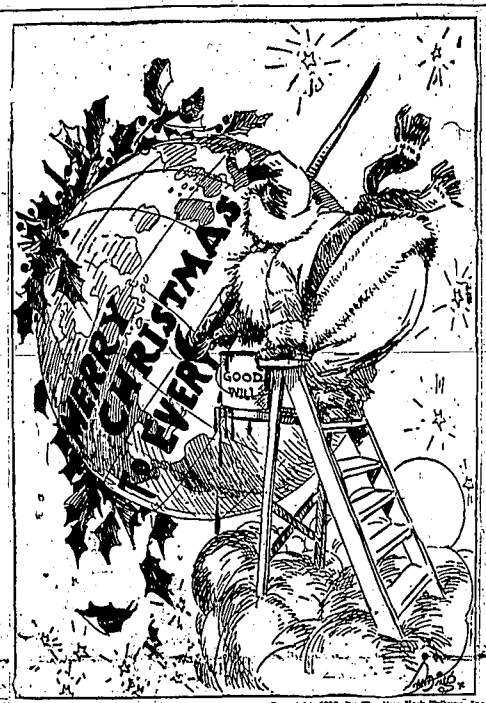

F.D.R. Quotes From Dickens' Christmas Carol During Radio Address

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP)—President Roosevelt held the nation tonight to keep Christmas all the year.

Making a tall community tree in Lafayette Square, he turned to the radio with a passage from his favorite Christmas story—Dickens' "Christmas Carol."

"On this eve of Christmas," he said, "I want to quote to you the words of old Scrooge when, after many vicissitudes, he had come to understand in his heart the greatness and the great opportunity of Christmas."

"I will honor Christmas in my heart and try to keep it all the year. I will live in the past, the present, and the future. The spirits of all three shall strive within me. I will not shut out the lessons that they teach."

The President thus shared with the nation a Roosevelt Yuletide custom. Each Christmas he reads the Dickens story to his own children and grandchildren.

COMMITTEE SEEKS LABOR AGREEMENT

Proposed Constitutional Amendment Would Regulate Hours, Wages

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP)—A secret committee named by George L. Berry, industrial coordinator, was reliably reported today to be striving for an agreement among labor groups on a proposed constitutional amendment to regulate hours and wages.

The committee was set up, Berry's intimates said, in the belief that a supreme court decision had made it impossible to coordinate relations between employers and employees until the commerce clause had been revised.

Regulation of Commerce (This clause says congress may regulate "commerce with foreign nations, and among the several states...") New Dealers had hoped to use it as a basis for wide regulation in social and economic fields, but made efforts to that end were halted by the supreme court.

"After extensive investigation," informed officials declared, "Senator Berry became convinced that the court's interpretation of the commerce clause is an insurmountable obstacle to industrial unity on the hours and wages of labor."

No Official Recognition The work of the committee, they said, was "not unknown" to the White House, although the administration had given it official recognition of its existence.

Unanimous agreement on the language of proposed change in the commerce clause was understood to be the current task of the committee.

Some leaders feared that too much tinkering with the language of the amendment might cost the support of certain national farm groups which have expressed some desire to see the constitution amended to give the federal control of taxation.

Some insisted that the constitution be amended to give an entirely different basis for the national economy and cannot be subjected to similar regulation.

Barrimore's Wife Claimed By Death

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Dec. 24 (AP)—After an illness of several months, Irene Penwick Barrimore died at her home today with her film actor husband, Lionel Barrimore, at her bedside.

Mr. Barrimore succumbed to a pulmonary condition induced by a recent attack of pneumonia. She was 54 years old.

Barrimore and his wife were known as one of the film colony's most devoted couples. Her devotion to her side during her semi-invalidism of seven years.

Mrs. Barrimore was born Irene Fritzel in Chicago. She went on the stage in 1904 in "Peggy From Paris," later playing the leads in several Broadway plays.

Barrimore played opposite her in "The Claw," in 1921 and they were married July 15, 1924, at Hollywood, Riverside, California. They played the leads in "Laugh, Clown, Laugh," two years later.

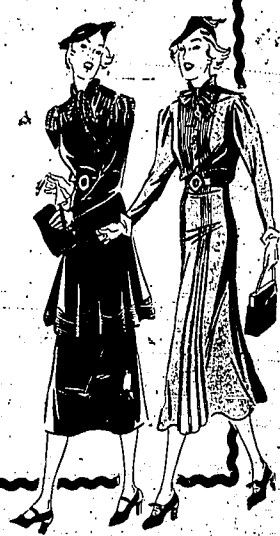

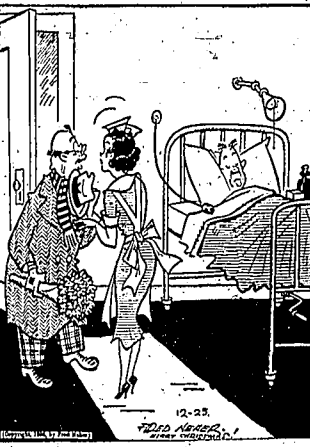

HIGHWAY ACCIDENT FATAL AT JEROME

Arthur T. Wilcox, 71, Instantly Killed When Struck by Car

JEROME, Dec. 24—Arthur T. Wilcox, 71, laborer on the Charles Marshall farm near here, was instantly killed this evening when struck by a passing automobile as he crossed the highway in front of the Marshall farm. The accident occurred about one-half mile north of Jerome.

Wilcox apparently started to return to the house, Sheriff Davis said, when he walked out in front of the Barnes car. Barnes steered across the highway to avoid striking the man, but Wilcox was caught on the bumper and carried about 40 feet. Both legs were broken and the back of his head was mangled, the sheriff reported. Barnes stopped his car and called Sheriff Davis and Coroner Wilcox.

Well Acquainted Barnes was accompanied by Joe Barnes, Harry Hubbell and Cleo Barnes, all of whom had been visiting potatoes at the farm of Alloys Hilt, across the highway from the Marshall residence. They were well acquainted with Wilcox.

Since 1906, Wilcox had spent a part of each year at the Marshall home, also residing with a friend, L. E. Upon at American Falls a part of each year. He is high up on a mining claim near Armo a part of the time.

The deceased is survived by a brother and a sister, residing in Vermont. The body rests at the Wilcox funeral home here.

Yuletide Wishes Travel Half 'Round Earth to Manila

Two Twin Falls residents, seated at their telephone Thursday evening, literally "talked into tomorrow."

The longest telephone call in point of distance ever made from Twin Falls, and possibly from Idaho, was made yesterday in the late afternoon when communication was established with Manila, Philippine Islands, through the Twin Falls office of the American Telephone and Telegraph company.

While the connection was established in Twin Falls around 10 o'clock yesterday evening, it was in the vicinity of 11 a. m. Friday (today) in Manila, a distance of nearly 12,000 miles away.

The call, according to Mel Dooling, local office manager, was routed from Twin Falls to Salt Lake City and from there to San Francisco. There it was transmitted by wireless to a receiving station at Manila, half way around the earth. From Manila the voices were carried by ground wires another 40 miles to Calanbang where connection with the party was made.

"It was the longest call ever to be put through out of Twin Falls," Mr. Dooling said, "and although long distance calls are not possible, I feel safe in saying it was the longest, in point of distance, ever to be made from an Idaho office."

The call was made from the home of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Jones, 137 Eighth avenue, and established with their daughter Ruth and her husband, Conrad L. Westphaler.

Republican Chairman Starts Revival Campaign Under Difficulties

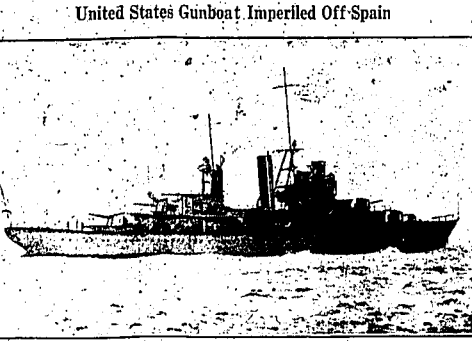

BET SUGAR WINS CHEMIST'S PRAISE

Industry Mass 'Great Progress,' Government Man Says

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP)—Dr. Henry D. Knight, chief of the bureau of chemistry and soils, said today the beet sugar industry had made "great progress" in the past four years in improving and standardizing the quality of beet sugar.

His remarks supplemented an earlier statement in which the bureau reported to Secretary Wallace that the industry should strive for a greater uniformity in the product to eliminate marketing losses.

Calling the earlier report "incomplete," Knight said it "indicates the industry has improved enormously the quality of its product as compared with the sugar of earlier years and that has resulted in a product suitable for the most discriminating consumers."

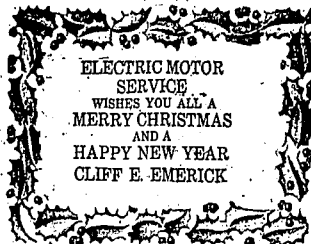
"Usually," Knight said, "there is a lag in the application of research results to actual commercial practice, but the beet sugar industry has been unusually progressive in applying new information."

"Usually," Knight said, "there is an additional factor in improvement, Knight said, the industry is adopting a new instrument developed by the bureau, a photometric refractometer. The instrument, he said, "does away with the element of human judgment in indicating the appearance of a sample of sugar, giving a numerical index which was described as "an important aid in applying closer standards of quality."

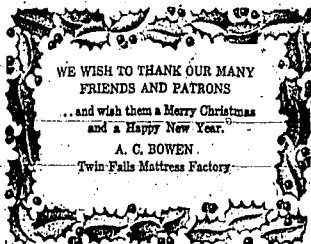

CROP INSURANCE ACTION PROMISED

Senator Pope Among Those Endorsing Committee Proposals

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP)—Quick-step action to get a crop insurance bill before congress was promised today as friends of the plan listened to favorable comments from some senate quarters.

Senator Pope (D-Idaho) said a bill embodying suggestions handed to President Roosevelt by a special committee studying an all-risk crop insurance plan for wheat, would be introduced "shortly after the session opened."

Departmental experts estimated that as much as \$100,000,000 might be needed to start the program. On Capitol Hill, several Western senators announced support for the plan.

NEW PEAK LOOMS FOR AUTO MAKERS

Production and Sale of Five Million Cars Set as Year's Goal

DETROIT, Dec. 24 (AP)—The motor-car industry will enter 1939 with its manufacturers and distributors more optimistic and enthusiastic than they have been at any time in the last decade.

Every company in production saw profits mount during last year; several were able to declare extra dividends and distribute bonuses to their workers; most of them were participants in one of the industry's heaviest expansion programs since 1928.

From every viewpoint, 1938 was a successful year. Untill profits remained narrow, but volume distribution was heavier than it has been in many years and all signs point to a continued consumer demand throughout the coming year.

See More Increases
Anticipating an aggregate output for the year of at least 4,000,000 vehicles, the industry's leading producers and sales executives are predicting a 1939 production increase of at least 10 per cent.

The closest possible kind of cooperation between producer and merchandiser has been one of the outstanding features of 1938 in the industry. It was this cooperation that placed in consumers' possession virtually every 1938 model motor car before the 1937 types went on sale.

lated the dealer must dispose of a specific number of used cars each month, before factory shipments could be released to him.

The result has been the greatest movement of used cars in the industry's history. Many of these older units, of course, will come back, again in the distribution of 1939 types, but already the manufacturing and selling divisions of the junk pile.
