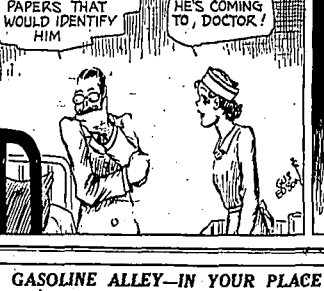

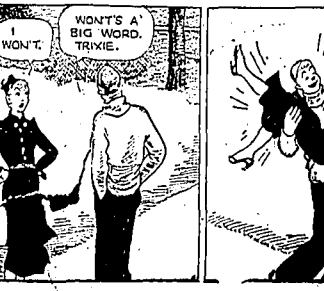

POTATOES LEAD IN IDAHO CROP VALUE

Production Statistics for 1938 Show Wheat in Second Place

Based on actual value, Idaho's five leading crops in 1938 were, in the order of their importance, potatoes, wheat, tame hay, dry beans, and apples, the annual crop summary compiled by Richard O. Ross, Idaho agricultural statistician and received Wednesday at the office of H. B. Hake, county-agent, showed.

Potatoes were raised during 1938 at 420,034,000; wheat, \$18,142,000; tame hay, \$17,281,000; dry beans, \$4,775,000; and apples, \$3,567,000, the report shows. Higher prices were responsible for most of the increased 1938 values. The report shows the actual volume of production of practically all crops except tame hay, clover seed, sugar beets, and corn was smaller than in 1937. Prices for most vegetable crops, however, averaged lower than a year ago. The total value of the 28 important field, fruit and vegetable crops produced in the state for 1938 is estimated at \$28,692,000. Total value of the same crop production in 1937 was \$27,194,000.

Past Year Witnesses Greatest Business Increase Since 1929

As the year 1938 nears its close, many will agree and records substantiate that it marked the generally best period of business increase since the recent depression period.

In the city of Twin Falls alone numerous merchants list of 1938 buying gains which far exceed those of many years, and in some instances outrank the greatest in their history. During the year, farmers, in general, realized greater prices for their produce than they had received since 1929. Ready markets were available for practically every Idaho product as drought struck the middle western states and raised crop prices at that area.

Records over the state show practically every farm product brought at \$1,301,000 this year against \$4,000,000 in 1937. Vegetable crops were worth less than in 1937. The valuation this year was \$800,000 against \$921,000 for last year. Bean production was slightly smaller than in 1937. The potato crop was about the same size as the 1935 crop, but sold at higher prices, and was worth \$2,626,000 to growers, the report states.
