State Department of Justice Is Considering Advisability of Calling Federal Grand Jury Immediately to Sift Evidence Already in Hand Against Profiteers

BOISE, Aug. 14.—Reports of extortionate prices being charged in different parts of the state are commencing to arrive at the office of United States Attorney McClellan, and commissioners everywhere are at work these days, gathering evidence to submit to grand juries as soon as they are called.

The local office of the department of justice is at present debating the advisability of requesting an immediate calling of a federal grand jury to consider the profiteering evidence collected in Boise or to await its regular convention in the latter part of September.

NEW WRIGLEY CHEWING GUM FACTORY, CHICAGO

The already tremendous chewing gum factory of the Wm. Wrigley Jr. Company, at 29th Street and Ashland Avenue, Chicago, is to be doubled in size. The first large unit of the new structure is now under construction. When completed, the new plant will comprise a million and a quarter square feet of space, devoted entirely to the manufacture of chewing gum. The area covered is six hundred by three hundred feet, the building being eight stories high with basement. It is of heavy reinforced concrete and steel, with terra-cotta exterior. Track facilities for loading fifty cars at one time are provided. Special features are a modern roof-garden, recreation hall, restaurant, hospital, welfare department, library, club rooms, smoking room, handball courts, gymnasium and showers. S. Scott Joy, architect, E. W. Sprout Co., General Contractor.

The strips form wheels that slip over into the upper pan. The dimensions given make a refrigerator of convenient size for home use, hold use indoors with efficient evaporating surface, but it is not necessary to follow strictly these dimensions. If a larger capacity is desired, the height of the refrigerator can be increased.

How It Operates.
The operation of the refrigerator shown in the illustrations is as simple as its construction. The lowering of temperature inside the refrigerator depends upon the evaporation of water. To change water from a liquid to a vapor, or to bring about evaporation, requires heat. As evaporation takes place heat is taken from the inside of the refrigerator, thereby lowering the temperature of the inside and the contents.

Keep the upper pan filled with water. The water is drawn by capillary attraction through the wick and saturates the cover. Capillary action starts more readily if the cover is first loosened by slipping it into water or throwing water upon it with the hand. The greater rate of evaporation the lower the temperature which can be secured. Therefore the refrigerator works best when rapid evaporation takes place. When the refrigerator is placed in a shady place, with the breeze and the air is warm and dry, evaporation goes on continuously and rapidly and the temperature inside the refrigerator is reduced. Under ideal conditions the temperature has been known to be reduced to 50 degrees F. When the air is damp the refrigerator will not work as well, since there is not enough evaporation. Moisture will find its way to the lower pan, but it will be drawn up into the covering by capillary attraction when the air becomes drier.

Care of Refrigerator.
The refrigerator should be regularly cleaned and oiled. If the framework, shelves, and pans are stifle encased they can more easily be kept in a sanitary condition. It is well to have two covers, so that a fresh one can be used each week and the soiled one washed and stored.

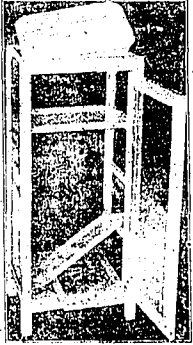

New Iceless Refrigerator is Constructed.

The roll-top type, which costs little more than the ordinary kind. The door, made to fit closely and fitted on brass hinges, can be equipped with a wooden latch. The bottom is lined with wire mesh. The top should be covered with screen wire. Adjustable shelves can be made of solid wood or strips of sheets of polished metal. Shelves made of poultry netting in light wood or frame shown in the illustrations, are probably the most desirable. These shelves rest on slide braces placed at desired intervals. A bread-tray pan, 18 by 10 inches, placed on the top and the frame rests in a track 1/2 inch high. All of the framework, the shelves, and the pans should receive two coats of white enamel. This makes an attractive appearance and one that can be kept clean. The screen wire also may receive the coats of enamel, which will prevent it from rusting. A cover of canvas, broad, striped, or duck is made to fit the frame. The slatwork side cut in canvas flannel is used. It will require about three yards of material. This cover is buttoned around the top of the frame and down the side on which the door is attached, under loose hooks and eyes or brass-headed tacks and eyes, worked in the material. On the front side arrange the hooks on the top of the door instead of on the frame and also fasten the cover down the left side of the door, showing a wide hem of the material in covering the place where the door closes. The door can then be opened without undressing the cover. The bottom of the cover should extend down into the lower pan. Four double strips, which taper to 8 or 10 inches in width, are sewed in the upper part of the cover.

The first of these trunk lines between New York and Chicago will be used for merchandise and is expected to be in operation within a year.

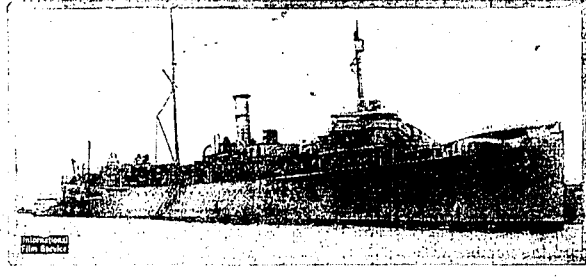
Mr. Diffin said that no thought could be given to passenger traffic until the freight line was established and in running order.
