President Will Ask Senate Committee To Report Treaty Without More Delay and Will Explain Clouded Portions

Will Tell Senators That Treaty Embodies Viewpoint of All Delegates to Conference—Senators Have Long List of Matters in Which They Desire Explanation

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—When President Wilson confers with the senate foreign relations committee next Tuesday he will ask that body to be given a longer delay, to report the treaty of Versailles to the senate earlier without further delay. He will ask that the treaty be brought to a vote in senate that not only the United States, but the nations of the world, can "set back to work."

It is understood to be the intention of the president to explain clouded portions of the treaty about as follows: First—That the treaty, as a whole, embodies the viewpoint of all of the delegates to the peace conference. Second—That its provisions were agreed to only after there had been a full and free discussion of the treaty's interests involved, and that through out the interests of the United States were safeguarded. Third—That the reason the treaty itself was finally drawn by the "small group" of three—Bismarck, Lloyd George and Clemenceau—was that the council of five—the three above named and Signor Orlando and Mr. Wilson—was unable to agree on the treaty after an exhaustive trial, and that the deliberations of the entire membership of the conference were productive of only a "free floating" atmosphere which could not reach unanimous agreement on any of the big questions in dispute. Fourth—That before the treaty was finally approved it was passed upon in plenary session by the entire body and associated peace delegates.

7—Liberal appropriations for increased work, and legislative authority to carry out necessary.
8—Appointment of a special committee to prepare and issue official statement for all information of the public of critical conditions affecting agricultural production for the coming year.
9—Prohibition bill reworded.

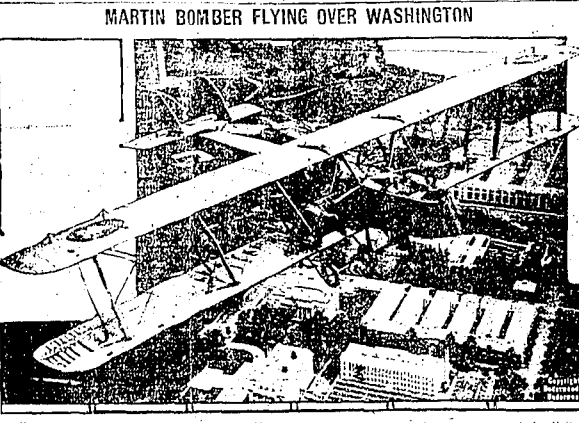

HUGE SUM TO BE SPENT ON ROADS

An exhaustive survey of the nationwide road program made by the U. S. Goodrich Rubber Co. has revealed the fact that the total Federal, state and county appropriation to be spent in new construction and maintenance of the nation's highways, amounts to \$300,294,562.

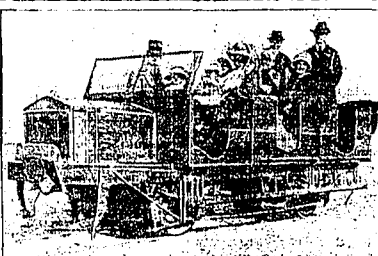

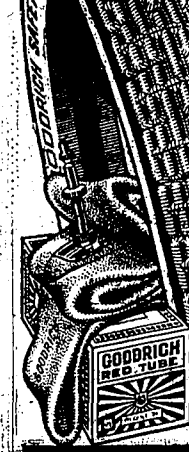

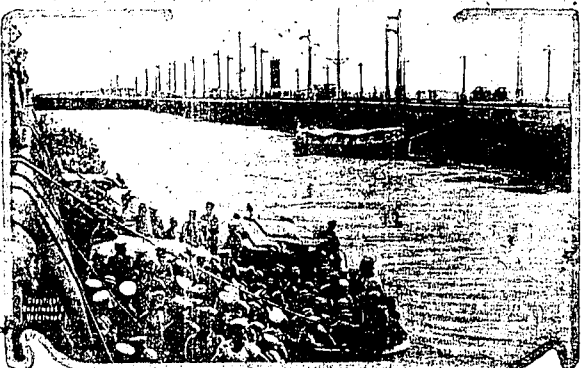

BY POOLING WOOL CLIP OF COMMUNITY SHEEP RAISERS CAN OBTAIN FULL VALUE



Buyers Purchasing Wool at Auction Sale.

By the United States Department of Agriculture. The wool grower who markets his wool as an individual is handicapped, for his clip is likely to be too small to induce the buyers to make any alterations in their accustomed methods of estimating wool values. By combining or pooling his wool with other growers and selling it cooperatively, it should be possible to prepare the entire clip of any grower so that it will be sold as a unit and the grower obtain the full market value for their product.

How to Organize Selling Clubs. When farmers of a community desire to combine their wool, one grower should be designated to act as an informal manager. He should make arrangements with all the growers to deliver their wool at a certain shipping point on a specified day. He should be on hand when the wool is graded, to see that the wool is properly weighed and that the correct amount of each grower's clip should be kept by the manager and a statement sent to the different growers showing the number of boxes and net weight of each grade. If possible, each grower should be present when the wool is weighed and the correct amount of each grade of wool is kept by the manager and a statement sent to the different growers showing the number of boxes and net weight of each grade.

Carefully Save Droppings. No matter how small the flock, the droppings should be carefully saved, stored and allowed to ferment for a few days before being used as fertilizer for corn or other crops. The manure should be used to increase the fertility of the soil.

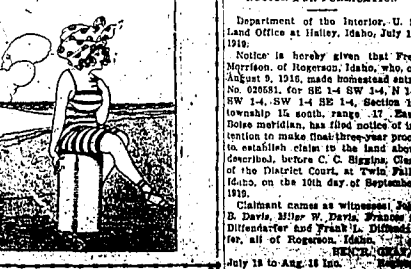
