Reference to Them Found in Writings of the Romans, and in English Literature.

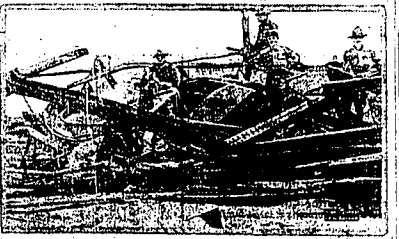
