SHOPMAN STRIKE MENACE TO OFF HEALTH

Market of Stores Now Rotting on Wharves

LACK OF MILK CAUSES CONCERN

Ferry and Tugboat Workers Spurn Request of Government That They Return to Work Pending Adjustment of Wage.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—The menace to the health of New York City arising out of the marine and allied strikes, which have completely paralyzed water traffic, was intensified today.

Disregarding the advice and warning of Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, the longshoremen at a meeting at Cooper Union voted to continue their strike, but all avenues to a settlement were not closed. It declares that the longshoremen's local shall again pass upon the question this afternoon.

Both the longshoremen and the ferry and tug workers have expressed the request of the government that they return to work until the settlement of their demand for higher wages.

Public health authorities are greatly concerned over the situation. With the food supplies already short, many tons of stores are rotting upon the wharves and in warehouses.

COMMITTEEN PASS THE BUCK

Return Steel Arbitration Resolution to Conference Without Recommendation

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—The committee of fifteen in President Wilson's industrial conference "passed the buck" today on the question of advising arbitration in the national steel strike.

Thomas L. Chadbourne, chairman of the committee, reported the members' resistance to the conference without recommendation. This brings the whole question of whether the conference will advise arbitration out into the open.

WILSON'S CONDITION CAUSES STOCK FLURRY

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—Inquiries over President Wilson's condition, unrelaxing his own scramble of selling stock market today. Stocks were generally higher, with a few exceptions.

PRESIDENT HAS RESTLESS NIGHT

General Condition Good—Bugged Congressional Adjournment Arouses Ire

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—Although President Wilson did not have a restless night, his general condition today is good. It was announced by official dispatches from the White House by Rear Admiral Gray T. Grayson, his steward.

The bulletin, signed by Grayson, Ruffin and Stitt, follows: "The president did not have a restless night last night. His restlessness was confined to the general condition of the nation, a condition from which he has suffered in the past and which has been a source of anxiety to him since he took office."

There was a fighting atmosphere about the White House today. It was learned that any efforts to adjourn congress on the contention that the president is too ill to conduct his duties will meet with strenuous opposition from the president himself.

The attitude of the friends of the president was this: "President Wilson has submitted a program of constructive legislation to congress. Let congress keep on the job, instead of being concerned with unfounded charges against the president's condition and pass the responsibility back into session again."

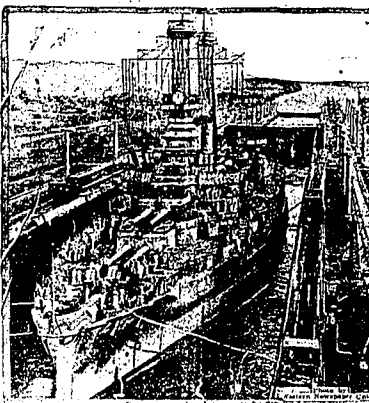
