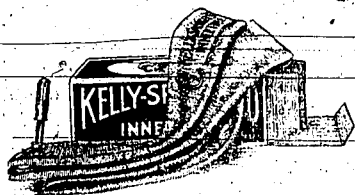

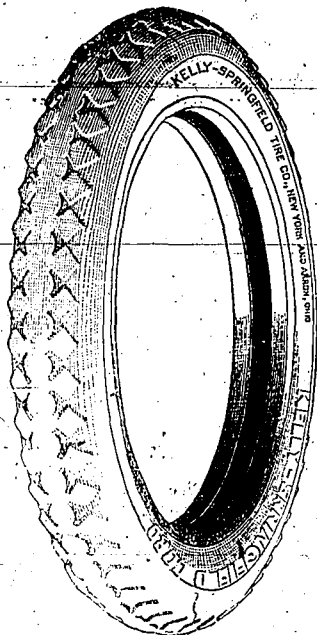

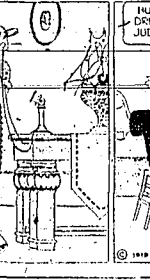

BIG STOCK SALE FOR BLACKFOOT

Southwestern Idaho Shorthorn Breeders' Association Stages Auction January 17.

BLACKFOOT, Jan. 7.—About 600 head of purebred registered Shorthorn stock will be sold from the auction block at Blackfoot fair grounds Saturday, January 17. This auction of purebred stock is being conducted as the first annual sale of the Southwestern Idaho Shorthorn Breeders' association and will bring to Blackfoot some of the best stock of this section of the state. The consignments consist of 322 bulls and two-year-old bulls, 322 heifers, pure bred heifers and choice young stock. Forty-three head will be offered for sale by breeders of Blackfoot, Firth, Aberdeen and the remainder will come from stockmen outside of this immediate vicinity. All of this stock has been tested for tuberculosis and is guaranteed free from disease.

BRITISH MANUFACTURERS LEARNED WOMEN WORKERS

LONDON, Jan. 6.—British employers have learned the value of women's labor during the war and now regret that a surplus of labor, due to demobilization of soldiers, necessitates laying off women workers. That is the finding of the Women's Industrial League, which aims to secure equality of treatment and opportunity of employment for women. Viscountess Rhondda is president. A questionnaire answered by 1,422 British firms, many of whom employ women labor for the first time during the war, expressed their selves almost without exception as being highly satisfied with woman labor, while a majority of them resented demobilization, lack of trade and uncertainty of future plans forced them to dismiss woman employees. "There are now 72,100 women employed by these 1,422 firms, which is 300,000 less than the number of men who were employed at the same time."
