Must Agree on R. R. Laws Before March

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—Agreement on legislation for the return of the railroads to their private owners on March 1 must be reached in the next fortnight to insure that legislation being enacted by that time, house and senate leaders believed today.

The senate and conference on the Bach and Cummins railroad bills have decided that some guarantee must be given the railroads. As to how this is to be obtained plan has been agreed to a compromise.

The plan as outlined in the senate Cummins bill is for the guarantee of five and one half per cent earnings on the value of the railroads... The house bill particularly leaves the question of guarantee to the argument of the house conferees that there should be a guarantee provided as soon as the door for compromise.

ADMITS TIGHT ORGANIZATION AGAINST FORD

Newberry Side Says Perfect Machine Was Necessary to Beat Best Adversary Man

CHANDLER RAPIDS, Feb. 3.—Admitting that the Newberry campaign organization was highly organized and well trained it "the most perfect political organization" ever put together, Judge Martin, counsel for Senator Newberry, today held that this was necessary under the circumstances attending the 1918 campaign between Newberry and Henry Ford for the U. S. senate.

"It was necessary because" Commander Newberry was running against the best effective man in America," he hurried at Judge and jury.

Entering a complete denial that Senator Newberry furnished money to his campaign fund, Judge Martin asserted that "not one dollar of his money was ever handled by any one" but that the Newberry backers, he declared, were prompted "not by pay but by patriotism, not by avarice but by Americanism."

At the beginning of his address Judge Martin described in detail the finances with which Senator Newberry and political retainers are charged. Miss Dakesian, who is not given exaggeration and has been conditions at first hand, says more than a million people are fast dying by starvation in Armenia and will perish unless American aid.

Here is an evidence to the sufferer of hundreds of helpless women and children by the Turks and a victim of the deportations, Miss Dakesian, an unusually pretty girl, says there is untold suffering in Armenia and Syria. She praises the efforts of the Near East Relief, formerly the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief, to save as many helpless people as possible in Constantinople, the capital of the Armenian republic, one hot meal is given out daily, and by this relief alone the city's death rate has been cut down a thousand daily to an average of thirty. 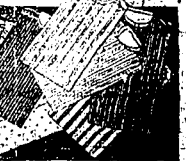
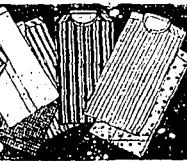
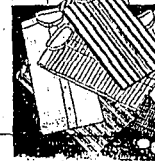

IF GOLD WERE MANUFACTURED: Suppose it is really possible to change base metals into gold.

Suppose it is really possible to change base metals into gold. Prof. Frederick Soddy of Oxford says it is in theory, and in fact the scientific method.

Suppose, then, that this theory—which, as a result of experiments with radium, seems to be really more than a theory—were turned to practical account, and modern scientists, fulfilling the dreams of ancient alchemists, produced gold at will.

Well, those who produced the gold, and the friends with whom they shared it, might be very rich—for a little while. They could buy anything they wanted—but for how long?

If gold were turned into gold, it is plain enough that soon the world would not be worth much more than the lead. Gold has its uses, of course, in the mechanical arts, but so has lead.

Gold, then, would lose its special value, which is based mainly on its limited supply. All the gold in the world would be the level of a base metal. And thus the world's money system, which is based on the bullion value of gold, would go smash—a five-dollar gold piece would not be worth any more than a silver quarter, or even a lead slug or an iron washer.

We may be just as well satisfied, therefore, that they're not manufacturing gold yet. At the present state of affairs, it would certainly not be a blessing. We have too much gold as it is, for the good of our present economic system.

THE SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT

The confidence of her belief in the victory of her cause was the measure of her willingness to endure all sorts of hardships for her principles.

What Mrs. Anthony began, hundreds of thousands of American women continue, spending time, energy and money in the effort to convince a majority of government of their right to a participation in it on equal terms with men.

In honor of American womanhood, as well as in memory of the courageous woman whose centenary is celebrated this month, let ratification of the suffrage amendment be quickly finished.

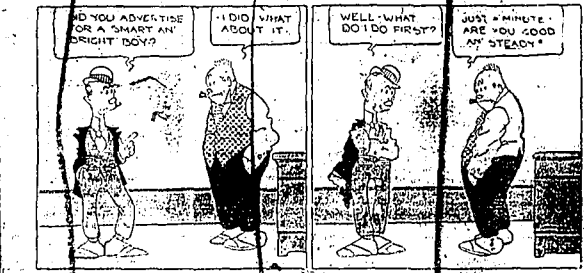
