

BRITISH SAY WE ARE FOR RETURN OF U.S.

Wilson's Protest on Adriatic Situations As Desire to Be Part of Supreme Council

LONDON, Feb. 15.—The allied premiers said this afternoon that they have adopted the view that President Wilson's protest against the Anglo-French Adriatic settlement has opened the way for a re-enterance of the United States to the supreme council.

The premiers are giving extensive care to the question, according to President Wilson's note, emphasizing the importance attached to the incident.

Several drafts have been drawn, but all were rejected as unsatisfactory after close scrutiny. An answer may be completed in time to hand to John W. Davis, the American ambassador, tonight.

**R. R. Officials Are
Accused of Forcing
Advantages in Price**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—Charges of manipulating by distribution of open cars to coal mines as a "sand bag" to compel operators to sell coal for rates which are lower than is paid by the public are made today against the railroad administration by Thomas H. Watkins, president of the Pennsylvania coal and coke corporation of New York City, in statement to the congressional committee investigating the situation.

Watkins charged that John B. Dugan, as chief purchasing agent of the railroad administration, was responsible for the practice.

Watkins charged that William G. McAdoo, as director-general, demanded the practice, and said that a ruling by President Wilson to stop it had been upheld by only a short time.

**Maryland Turns
Down Suffrage**

ANAPOLIS, Feb. 17.—Ballotization in Maryland of the Susan B. Anthony suffrage amendment failed this afternoon, when the house of delegates voted against ratification, 65 to 32. The Senate, however, voted to call a referendum this afternoon and plans to report the suffrage ratification resolution unfalteringly.

**Worker Ridicules
Prohibition Argument Used
by Shipping Board**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—A bill to ban the sale of the 29 ex-German ships by the shipping board and to require it to take immediate steps to recondition them for the upholding of the American neutrality law was introduced in the Senate this afternoon by Senator Jones (Democrat of Washington), chairman of the senate commerce committee.

There was no discussion of the Jones measure. Senators present when he presented it gave him approval of it by their silence.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—"Probable cannot be used as the root to cover up the real conditions of our shipping industry," declared Wane Wheeler, general counsel of the nation's seafarers, today in a statement to the shipping board.

The Page of the shipping board, that "dry" passenger liners of the government could not compete with "wet" passenger liners of foreign registry.

"If prohibition is the only handle to succeed in America, it will be well continued," Wheeler said.

"This action of prohibition simply serves as an excuse for covering up other conditions that have more to do with the passenger ship troubles than the absence of liquor. Other nations operate their shipping under favorable conditions as to wages, cost of service, and fewer hindrance and courageous by legislation.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—Admiral W. S. Benson, U. S. N., retired, will be appointed as chairman of the United States shipping board to succeed John Barton Payne, who has been nominated as secretary of the interior. President Wilson has asked Congress to confirm the appointment.

The appointment will not be made for a month or six weeks as chairman Payne desires to complete work which he has already started in the shipping board.

Admiral Benson was formerly chief of naval operations of the navy department.

**Air Mail Service
Across Continent
Is Plan Proposed**

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 18.—Aerial mail service between Los Angeles and New York via Omaha and Chicago is being sponsored before the postoffice authorities by Congressmen Daniel L. Smith, of California, and John T. Hart, of Illinois, and establishment of such a service in the near future is regarded quite certain, it was announced here today.

The schedule would include Los Angeles to Omaha in a day and a half, Chicago in less than a day, and New York in two days, or about a half flying hour. The plan obliges the airlines to supply two planes, with the government providing two fast mail planes.

AMERICA WILL NOT
RE-ENTER SUPREME
COUNCIL OF ALLIES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—The United States is unlikely to name a representative to meet with the council of premiers, the government said today.

The government said the view is held that the state control has been dissolved and that further negotiations must be through diplomatic channels and that any action of the council of premiers should be submitted to this government through such channels.

President Wilson is not likely to communicate early—possibly established and would be more satisfactory than by the appointment of a representative with full powers to meet with the premiers.

CANADA TROOPS MADE BEST SHOWING

Canadian's Opinion, However, Is
Not Concurred in by
U. S. Officials

TORONTO, Feb. 15.—British Gen. Sir Arthur Currie, commanding the Canadian corps, addressed before the Canadian club, declared that the Canadians with 100,000 men obtained almost exactly the same results in the last 100 days of the war as the Americans with 650,000 men. General Andrew was referring to the great American offensive on the Argonne-Meuse front, when he made the comparison.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—General March, chief of staff, and other high officials of the war department refused to make comment on the statement of Brig. Gen. Andrews that the British had obtained better results in the last 100 days of the war than the Americans with larger forces.

Officials of the war department, however, stated that statistical records of the war were open. These records show that American forces were superior to the British in every line at the date of the armistice, while all British forces and the Poles were holding but 18 per cent.

It was pointed out that the Canadian forces were fighting at the north line and military experts have agreed that the British opposition of the Germans was in the center of the line of the battle where American and French forces were threatening to cut the Germans' lines of supply.
