WASHINGTON, March 6.-Failure of the senate to ratify the peace treaty at this session would mean expenditure of \$555,000,000 during the next three or four years to increase the fighting strength of the United States navy, Secretary Daniels today told the house naval affairs committee in outlining the government's policy on naval construc-

Because of the delay to the treaty Daniels recommended that 69 vessels, including several large fighting ships, be authorized in addition to the three-year program of 1916, which has been only about one-third

At the same time he declared if the senate definitely decided the United States shall not be a member of the league of nations, the na-

United States shall not be a member of the league of nations, the nation must enter upon a huge construction program that will make our navy "incomparably" the greatest in all the world.

The program Daniels recommended today calls for an additional expenditure for naval construction of \$195,000,000 in addition to an estimated expenditure of \$360,000,000, necessary to complete the three-year building program of 1916. Present plans would call for the completion of this enlarged program by 1924.

About 38 small craft, without any capital ships, would be sufficient under these circum-

Well, here is our old friend free silver again. It is proposed by Senator Thomas, of Colorado, at practically the old 1896 ratio of sixteen to one. Only Senator Thomas improves upon the Bryan idea by demanding international bimetalism, as against a lone hand by the United States.

It is not likely that the Colorado semitor will get any farther with his bimetalism campaign now than Colonel Bryan did 24 years ago. True, there is a nebulous belief forming in the minds of many citizens that the recent rise in the price of silver proves the Commoner was right in 1896. But the rise in silver proves no such thing; it only seems to do so on the surface. As a matter of fact, it might be shown that it proves just the opposite. There is nothing to prevont the continued rise in the price of silver, or its fall, either; we should be continually at the mercy of the silver mine owners.

Not that we are exempt at any time from the power of the gold

mines, but it must be remembered that there is engagarity stability in gold, while silver shows great instability. A governmental deerge that so, much silver shows great instability.
